Coming Off Back-to-Back Losing Seasons ASU Prepares for Huge 2010 Campaign

What's going on in Sun Devil Country? Everyone wants to know – especially in the ASU Football Family!

In 2007, when Coach Dennis Erickson led his first Devil squad to a fine 10-3 mark and a portion of the Pac-10 title, many ASU fans moved closer to the program, thinking great days were on the way.

But then the Sun Devils finished 5-7 in 2008 and 4-8 a year ago – showing a first-rate defense but not nearly enough on offense. How often in the past have A-State backers worried about their team's ability to score? So here we are.

The general consensus is that ASU is going to struggle again, finishing far down in the Pac-10 standings this fall.

Erickson doesn't intend to let that happen and he brought in Offensive Coordinator Noel Mazzone to ignite the Sun Devil attack.

A three-way battle at quarterback between sophomore Brock Osweiler (6-8, 245), junior Steven Threet (6-5, 237) and junior Samson Szakacsy (6-4, 205) is ongoing at press time. The winner of that contest must play well for the Sun Devils to show improvement.

Early indications are that the offense will feature more speed and better talent – both in the backfield and receiver positions. In fact, the upgrade in talent at these positions appears to be significant.

Sophomore Cameron Marshall (5-11,

220) is the leading returning rusher with a modest 280 yards. He should really shine with more opportunities. But there's plenty of competition with sophomore James Morrison (5-11, 208), true freshman Deantre Lewis (5-10, 189) and sophomore Jamal Miles (5-10, 180) pushing for playing time.

Miles is an interesting case. The general philosophy of the new ASU offense is to throw often and get the ball into the hands of your playmakers. Miles is superquick and figures to break some big plays this fall. He'll split time at running back and wide receiver. If he doesn't redshirt, true freshman Kyle Middlebrooks (5-9, 176) will play a similar role.

The receiving corps is deep and talented. And definitely not respected at all heading into the '10 campaign. That's based on the graduation losses of Kyle Williams and Chris McGaha, who merely combined for 277 catches for 3,868 and 27 TDs in their Sun Devil careers.

Don't be alarmed. Kerry Taylor (6-0, 197) and Gerell Robinson (6-4, 223) are back to make amends for so-so production thus far in their collegiate careers.

Veterans T.J. Simpson (6-1, 189) and Brandon Smith (6-2, 202) return from injuries last year. JC transfers George Bell (6-3, 198) and Mike Willie (6-4, 215) look like sure-fire contributors. University of Oregon transfer Aaron Pflugrad (5-10, 180) is an outstanding slot receiver and youngsters J.J. Holliday (6-0, 170) and A.J. Pickens (5-10, 172) are ready to play.

I could be dead wrong, but I predict the Devils will stretch the field this year and put a lot more pressure on opposing defenses. They have good size, much better speed, outstanding depth and are hungry to erase the memories of the 2009 fiasco.

Tight end notables are junior Trevor Kohl (6-1, 248) and redshirt freshman Chris Coyle (6-2, 235).

Of course, the line must block for everything to work properly. The early signs are good there too – with Evan Finkenburg (6-6, 290), Brice Schwab (6-7, 330), Garth Gerhardt (6-1, 305), Adam Tello (6-3, 290), Dan Knapp (6-5, 277), Mike Marcisz (6-5, 304), Kody Koebensky (6-4, 303), Kyle Johnson (6-7, 292) and Andrew Sampson (6-3, 300) contributing.

Senior Jon Hargis (6-3, 312) was injured in the spring, but is working at a fever pace to return to action early in the year. Incoming JC transfer Aderious Simmons (6-7, 310) looks like he could be a factor, but at press time was waiting for eligibility clearance. Only time will tell, but Erickson seems to have assembled a quality offensive line.

The Pac-10's number one defense last year was definitely wearing Maroon and Gold. ASU allowed just 297.6 yards per game, even though the weak ASU offensive attack provided little protection.

Expect for the Devils to be just as good – if not better – in 2010. The entire defensive line returns – less Dexter Davis – along with a dynamite linebacking group and a much more athletic secondary.

Big junior DT Lawrence Guy (6-5, 293) should pace the line, with help from Saia Falahola (6-1, 300), James Brooks (6-5, 280), Jamaar Jarrett (6-5, 252), Greg Smith (6-3, 255), Jamarr Robinson (6-2, 247), Will Sutton (6-2, 300), Bo Moos (6-0, 295), Dean DeLeone (6-2, 250) and Toa Tuitea (6-3, 261).

Corey Adams (6-3, 294), formerly a prep All-American at Saguaro High School, enters his sophomore year attempting to overcome a back injury that cut short his freshman year. The Sun Devil defensive front does need to exert more pressure on the quarterback and incoming frosh Nduka Onyeali (6-1, 240) could provide some assistance in that area.

The linebacking corps is formidable – to say the least. Led by Freshman All-America Vontaze Burfict (6-3, 245) and his high school teammates Brandon Magee

(5-11, 230) and Shelly Lyons (6-2, 230) – both sophomores – ASU will definitely run to the football.

Replacing graduates like Mike Nixon and Travis Goethel, both in NFL camps right now, is not easily done. But ASU has a good mix of talent and experience to overcome the losses. Senior Gerald Munns (6-4, 242) will see plenty of action, heading a group of Colin Parker (6-1, 228), Oliver Aaron (6-0, 208) and Anthony Jones (6-2, 215) who will provide support. True freshman Carl Bradford (6-1, 230) has been impressive enough in the early workouts to possibly play himself out of a redshirt year.

The secondary was probably the weakest part of the '09 defense, but it appears those days are over.

Junior Omar Bolden (5-10, 195) and sophomore Deveron Carr (5-11, 184) could be the best cornerback tandem in Tempe in many years. Bolden was super in the spring and, barring injury, should be a real team leader.

And ASU even has some depth at the corners, thanks to the likes of Osahon Irabor (5-11, 180), LeQuan Lewis (5-11, 193), Josh Jordan (6-1, 173) and newcomer Alden Darby (6-0, 180).

The competition at safety is terrific; the starters should be Keelan Johnson (6-0, 201) and Clint Floyd (5-10, 198), with Eddie Elder (5-10, 186) and Max Tabach (6-2, 208) the primary backups.

The Sun Devils suffered when Thomas Weber went down with an injury last year. Even when he returned for the final games, he wasn't himself. Erickson and company are counting on Weber to be a dominant weapon once again.

Tops in Final Year of 5A-1 Competition

Yes, 2010 will definitely be a year to remember. It's the final year of state classifications (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A-1, 4A-2, 5A-1, 5A-2). Next year, all Arizona Interscholastic Association member schools will be moving to a division system (with the largest schools being designated as Division I and then Division II, etc.).

So, in 2011, big school football powers like Hamilton, Chandler and Brophy will be vying for the Division I title and there will be considerable reshuffling of alignments.

But let's not get ahead of ourselves. HAMILTON Coach Steve Belles and his team are making plenty of history themselves these days. The Huskies have merely captured five state crowns in the past seven years, the best upper classification run ever in Arizona.

A year ago, Hamilton finished with a perfect 14-0 mark, besting Mesa in the finals. Belles now sports a remarkable 52-3 record in his four years on campus.

And the cupboard is far from bare. Forty-one lettermen return from that team, including five starters on defense

and four on offense. Graduates from last year's 8-1 junior varsity will also be available to help the Huskies stay on track.

Belles will once again feature a terrific offensive line, led by seniors Christian Westerman (6-5, 282) and Tyler Johnstone (6-5, 235). Westerman will finish his high school career as one of the most decorated players ever to put on a uniform in Arizona. He's generally regarded as the state's number one college prospect and has already given an oral commitment to the University of Texas. Johnstone is a great player in his own right and will

play at the next level at the University of Oregon.

The starting signal-caller will be senior Kyren Poe, who played both quarterback and wide receiver for the Huskies last fall. He threw for nearly 700 yards, ran for over 400 yards and caught 14 passes for another 200 yards, finishing the season with seven touchdowns. He'll be a real asset for Belles and company.

Poe will work with a fine receiving corps, namely WR Tanner Clay (6-3, 185), TE Jacob Andrews (6-3, 210) and WR Kendyl Taylor (5-11, 180). Clay won allregion honors in '09. Andrews is a good receiver and maybe even a better blocker. Taylor is the younger brother of Kerry Taylor, a former Hamilton standout and currently a senior receiver for the ASU Sun Devils. Kendyl saw limited duty as a sophomore wideout, but has already established himself as a great kick returner. He brought back his first attempt of the '09 season for 99 yards and a touchdown against St. Mary's. For the year, he averaged a stunning 49.8 yards per return.

The Husky running game will rely on Jai Johnson (5-8, 205), who averaged nearly seven yards per carry in a supporting role last year.

Defensively, Hamilton will feature DT Shaq Jenkins (6-2, 263), LB Mike Liebrock (6-3, 197), DB Cedric Parker (6-0, 175) and LB/SS Tyler Rutt (6-0, 192). All four are honors candidates.

"Hundley is the most recruited athlete in my 40-year career," says Ewan.

He's one of four starters returning on offense. The others are WR Michael Okonkwo, OL Corey Niass and OL Zach Hemmila. Okonkwo (6-1, 185) is an allregion performer who also excels in track. Niass (6-3, 275) is invaluable in the trenches. Hemmila (6-3, 280) has a bright future

"Zach is one of the top offensive linemen in Arizona this year and he's only a junior," says Ewan.

Other notable Wolves are RB Oshae Hatcher, RB John Bishop, WR Lloyd Mills, WR Andre Norris, WR Deselle Dean, OL Aldo Lobio, OL Darren Handy, DL Terrell Patton, DL EJ Odigwe, DL, Calvin Thomas, DL Richard Winston, LB Aaron Mayo, LB Cody Bradford, LB Rufus Green, DB Jamal Vargas, DB Kamron Reed, DB Paul Perkins, DB Devon Centers and DB Ryan Knapik.

Vargas, a senior, is the lone returning regular on defense.

BROPHY should be back in the hunt this fall. After all, Coach Scooter Molander welcomes back 35 lettermen from a club that won nine of 12 contests.

Versatile senior Josh Dennard, a 5-10, 180-pounder with 4.5 speed, is a talented wide receiver who also shines as a DB. QB Chase Knox to WR Josh Dennard is a familiar combination to Brophy fans.

Ron Wisniewski is the new head coach at **RED MOUNTAIN**. Fourteen starters return and are working to improve on last season's 6-5 record. Wisniewski comes to RMHS after spending the last 21 years coaching at the collegiate level.

His primary contributors figure to be DB/WR Jacob Tune (6-2, 190), OLB Devin Gordon (6-3, 230), WR/DB EJ Cordova (5-8, 175), WR/DB Kyle Guanell (5-11, 185), OL Joel Sundergaard (6-3, 250), LB Jorge Pinero (5-9, 200), WR Coleton Thornton (5-9, 170) and LB Mick Wright (5-9, 190) – all twelfth-graders.

Coach Kelley Moore did a masterful job of guiding his **MESA** Jackrabbits through the 5A-1 playoffs last year. In fact, his team reached the finale.

Overall, the Jackrabbits finished 9-5 and 14 lettermen – but just two starters – return. Senior Tony Vaitafa (6-2, 210) could be one of the better tight ends in the state; he'll also see playing time at linebacker.

Gilbert returns a nice blend of experience and talent at the skill positions and in the lines. When the Tigers have the ball, you can anticipate players like RB Tanner Hall (5-11, 190, Sr.), WR Drew Stankiewicz (5-11, 165, Sr.), QB Young Tanner (5-10, 160, Sr.), QB Nathaniel Causey (6-3, 205, Sr.), RB Greg Esquibel (5-9, 175, Sr.), RB/WR Marcus Brantley (6-0, 180, Jr.) and WR Bobby Fletcher (5-9,

150, Sr.) will make their presence felt in the months ahead.

The interior line play will feature OL/LB Dalten Lane (6-1, 210, Jr), OL/DL Joseph Schultz (6-2, 190, Jr.), OL/DL Dylan Azona (5-10, 225, Sr.) and OL/DL Nick White (6-5, 250, Sr.).



Chaparral Seeks to Defend 5A-2 Crown Centennial, MDN, Pinnacle, Westview to Challenge



As a sophomore quarterback, Connor Brewer ((7) guided his Chaparral Firebirds to the 5A-2 state title a year ago. We think there are many more great days ahead for Coach Charles Ragle's team (Paynter's Pics).

Around the turn of the century, the dominant team in Arizona 4A Football was **CHAPARRAL**. In fact, with Ron Estabrook at the helm, the Firebirds took home championships in 1999, 2000 and 2002.

Then, slowly but surely, crosstown rival Saguaro emerged as the team to beat, winning state crowns in 2006, 2007 and 2008. So, when Coach Charles Ragle and his guys moved up to the 5A-2 classification, Firebird fans could at least look forward to playoffs free of Saguaro. Of course, Centennial was waiting to challenge one and all 5A-2 rivals.

But Chaparral won nine of 10 regular season games before beginning the playoffs as the #2 seed. What followed was consecutive wins over Perry (49-0), Millennium (54-32), Desert Mountain (42-14) and Marcos de Niza (34-21). And the

Firebirds made their first year of 5A-2 football one to remember.

What do they do for an encore? Well, Ragle has a fine team returning, led by a formidable trio of standouts. Big tackle Andre Yruretagoyena (6-5, 280) will definitely open some holes up front. He's a Firebird this year and then plans to continue his career for the University of Oregon Ducks in 2011. Junior signal caller Connor Brewer (6-2, 185) is already earning rave reviews and he's only a junior. Another junior, Davonte Neal (5-10, 180), is a transfer from Cesar Chavez HS and will see action at both wide receiver and defensive back. He has 4.4 speed.

The senior safety tandem of Colby Targun (5-11, 190) and Colton Bishop (5-10, 185) is a headache for opponents.

Additional support will come from LB Hunter Gregg (6-0, 210), OLB Kyle Combs

(6-2, 220), DL Justin Jackson (6-3, 260), DL Sean Kunzla (6-2, 240) and OG Nick Plimpton (6-0, 250) – all seniors.

Altogether, Chaparral has 42 returning lettermen, including 16 starters. Ragle is starting his fourth year with the Firebirds and his record stands at 35-6 over that span. Not bad. And about to get even better.

Believe me, it isn't easy to pick against the **CENTENNIAL** Coyotes, as Coach Richard Taylor attempts to lead his squad back to the top spot. And we're favoring Chaparral by just an inch or so.

The Coyotes finished 13-1 last year, closing out a remarkable five-year run. In that time, Centennial won three titles, finished second once and reached the semis once. Taylor welcomes back 30 lettermen from his '09 club.

Among the outstanding veterans are a

trio of senior tailback-linebackers – Tevin Ray (6-0, 200), Jebron Harrington (6-0, 205) and Vegas Johnson (5-10, 190). Harrington plans on playing for San Diego State next year.

As usual, Centennial will feature some terrific linemen, namely C/DL Jake Abbott (6-3, 263), OL Wilson January (6-5, 265) and OL Hunter Finn (6-1, 235). Abbott could very well be the best of this year's group. Taylor is also counting on WR/S Julien Singleton (5-9, 165, Sr.) and TB/S Zach Hoffpauir (5-10, 190, Jr.) to contribute heavily.

Coach Roy Lopez has to be proud of his guys at MARCOS DE NIZA. Lopez is in his 15th year at the Tempe school, the last seven as head coach. His Padres advanced to the semis in 2006, the quarters in 2007, the semis in 2008 and finally the finals in 2009.

A prime-time achievement was MDN's 16-14 triumph over Centennial in the '09 semifinals, ending a 39-game winning streak for the Coyotes. Eleven starters are back in uniform from that Marcos de Niza team.

Lopez is expecting big things from five seniors who have started since their sophomore year, namely CB/WR JeRyan Butler (5-10, 178), RB/SS Dominic Sotelo (5-7, 180), WR/FS Martwon Weaver (6-0, 177), RB/DB Anthony Shivers (6-0, 190) and DE/TE Christian Mancha (6-2, 215). That's a solid nucleus.

PINNACLE is another team making strides. The Pioneers were 10-2 last year and entered the playoffs as the #3 seed. They lost a heartbreaker, 21-17, in the quarterfinals. Coach Dana Zupke has 30 varsity veterans back and members of last season's 7-1-1 JV. Zupke is now in his eighth year at Pinnacle; his teams are 48-29 during that time period.

WESTVIEW rounds out our Top Five. Coach Jeff Bowen has a 53-31 record in his seven years with the Knights. Bowen and company have been consistent playoff participants, even reaching the finals a couple of times. But, like so many 5A-2 schools, they just haven't been able to get by Centennial. And that's what happened a year ago, when Westview defeated Boulder Creek in the opening round but was eliminated by Centennial in the quarters.

Maybe 2010 will yield a different result. The Knights have 30 lettermen back, with some good young players available from last season's 6-3 JV and 9-0 Freshman squads.

The two standouts should be C/DT Brennan Bowen (6-1, 275) and TB/CB Jordan Champion (5-10, 175); both are all-state caliber players. Champion has 4.4 speed.

There's a nice blend of talent spread between the junior and senior classes. Coach Bowen likes what he sees from OT Zach Nolte (6-2, 245, Sr.), WB Shayne Miller (5-7, 155, Jr.), LB Jacob Cozza (6-2, 205, Sr.), LB Zach Chavez (5-10, 200, Sr.), SE Dylan Caballero (5-9, 160, Sr.), TE

Coach Dan Friedman has some momentum going in the right direction for the Jaguars at **BOULDER CREEK**, where 28 letterwinners are back on campus. An impressive 28 lettermen return from last year's 7-4 unit; that includes 14 starters.

Topping the list are TE/DE Zack Brown (6-3, 230) and RB/RS Mike Contreras (5-7, 175) – both seniors who should receive region and state accolades.

Returning starters include RB Phillip Bayus (5-7, 175, Sr.), QB Trevor Bonifasi (5-9, 165, Jr.), OL/DL Austin Farnlof (6-2, 250, Jr.), MLB Taylor Reber (5-11, 185, Sr.), OL Jacob Rodriguez (6-3, 250, Sr.), OL Colten Johnson (5-10, 270, Sr.), DB Jimmy Boulton (5-9, 170, Jr.) and OLB Sean Pratt (5-11, 165, Jr.). Junior transfer Marquis Bundy (6-3, 170) will add some talent and speed to the receiving corps.

Reggie Gilbert, an early commit to the University of Arizona, leads 30 returning lettermen at **BETTY FAIRFAX**. He's a 6-3, 238-pound combo tight end-defensive end for Coach Kevin Belcher.

The Stampede completed 2009 with a solid 6-4 slate and looks forward to the upcoming campaign. Besides Gilbert, Coach Belcher is relying on CB Deven Proby (6-0, 170, Sr.), DT/FB Dwight Melvin (6-2, 250, Jr.), RB/SS Esteban Hernandez (5-10, 170, Sr.) and QB Kurtis Walls (6-2, 190, Jr.) to aid the cause.

Returning 20 starters from a winning team is always a nice way to start the year.

"The 2009 season was a memorable one for **DESERT MOUNTAIN**," says Head Coach Tony Tabor. "Only one other team had made the playoffs (1997) and no team had won a playoff game. The 2009 team ended up one short of the state championship game."

The Wolves defeated Ironwood Ridge and Pinnacle before losing to Chaparral in the semifinals. Overall they finished with nine wins and four losses.

"We graduated 31 seniors, so we have a lot of rebuilding to do this year. But we have some nice skill kids returning in QB Drew Seaman and REC/S Allen Temunovic," says Tabor.



A half dozen senior performers – R/OLB Matt McElroy (6-1, 180), R/CB Trevor Ermisch (6-1, 170), DL/OL Tom DeVito (5-9, 180), LB Eddy Beurlein (6-1, 215), OT/DE Kyle Newcomb (6-3, 200) and OL/DE Chase Hardesty (5-10, 190) – will set the pace.

Mo Latu, a 6-3, 305-pound force at center and defensive lineman, is the best player in the history of **PERRY** High School. Of course, that's not a long history, but Latu is a great player. More than a few universities want him on their team



Well, the **SAGUARO** Sabercats came back down to earth in 2009 ... at least a little. They lost three games and didn't win their fourth straight 4A-1 state crown. In fact, Coach John Sanders' record fell to 38-3 in his three years at the Scottsdale school. But really now? This is still one of the truly premier football programs in our state and now they want their title back.

Of course, Canyon Del Oro, the

defending champs from Tucson, are and should be favored; they return a ton of talent, including 2009 Arizona Player of the Year Ka'Deem Carey. But this will be decided on the field and Saguaro is formidable.

Cyrus Hobbi (6-4, 285) anchors both lines and he's in the mold of recent Sabercat stars like Corey Adams, Kody Koebensky, Kody Innes and Jordan McDonald. He might be the best of the bunch. Providing support is senior OL/DL Dallas Noriega (6-1, 285).

Senior Teddy Ruben (5-8, 165) easily topped the 1,000-yard mark in both passing and rushing; he's a good one. No problem finding someone to catch the football. Wideouts Brock Haman (6-4, 235), Jon Lindemann (6-4, 200) and Kyle Young (6-4, 180) are giant targets with surprising speed. They'll also key the defense, along with LB/RB Danny Clark

(6-1, 225) and DB/RB D.J. Foster (6-0, 185), a junior.

The **BRADSHAW MOUNTAIN** roster is loaded with all-region and all-state type performers. And many of the BMHS opponents are picking the Bears to make a serious run at the state trophy. Are they ready?

Coach Chuck Apap thinks they are. He lists nine players – LB/K/P Andy Rosas (5-11, 175, Sr.), C/NG Brady Cabral (6-4, 303, Sr.), QB/CB Tyler Audsley (5-10, 155, Jr.), WR James Reyes (6-4, 175, Sr.), RB/OLB Shon Do (5-10, 157, Sr.), DT Eric Jolley (6-3, 200, Sr.), RB John Kelley (5-9, 160, Sr.), LB/TE Colton Willey (6-0, 180, Jr.) and OT Jacob Julien (6-0, 263, Jr.) – as honors candidates.

You might also pay attention to CB Damien Otero (5-11, 145, So.), S Kevin Wallace (6-0, 150, Jr.), DT Adrian Calderon (5-9, 195, Sr.), OG/LB Drew Perry (5-9, 175, Sr.), OG Sam Barger (5-10, 180, Sr.), FB/LB Adam Trzeciak (6-0, 181, Jr.), FB/LB Carlos Gonzalez (5-6, 180, Jr.), OLB Taylor Moore (6-4, 172, So.) and LB Anthony VanDyke (5-8, 180, Sr.).

Coach Chad DeGrenier guided his CACTUS SHADOWS Falcons to a sparkling 11-1 campaign last year. In fact, their only loss was a 63-42 shootout versus Sabino in the quarterfinals. Fourteen starters are back to do battle again this fall

DeGrenier has good size in linemen Alex Yazdi (6-2, 250), Joey Hughes (6-0, 230) and Parker Larue (6-1, 240) – all seniors. The headlining receivers are John Leonard (6-3, 210), Joree Schneider (5-9, 165) and Max Gersh (6-0, 178), while Nic Ericson (5-10, 180) is a playmaker in the secondary.

Remember a few years back when Prince Amukamara was **APOLLO**'s best player. He won many postseason awards as a running back before taking his game to the University of Nebraska. I read somewhere the other day that Amukamara might be the first senior picked in this year's NFL Draft. He's a lockdown corner now!

Coach Kelly Epley has a 49-48 record

in his nine years at AFHS. Last year the Owls were 5-6, losing to Saguaro in the first round of the playoffs. Seventeen letterwinners return from that team.

Besides Huckaby and Vaughn, Coach Epley is hoping TE/DE Alberto Zazueta (6-3, 210), OT/DT Maynard Adam (6-2, 225), TE/DT Austin Langtry (6-1, 230), QB/DE Fabian Ganza (6-0, 225), OT/DL Toney Williams (6-1, 240) and FB/DE Kamryn Dotson (6-2, 235) bring home plenty of wins.

It wasn't that many years ago that **APACHE JUNCTION** High School really struggled in football. With recent standouts like Shane McCullen and Cy Maughmer, the tide has turned. Last year the Prospectors wound up 7-4 after entering the playoffs as the #6 seed.

Coach Rich Milligan has seven varsity regulars returning, as well as some good players from a 6-0-2 JV. He's looking for leadership and strong performance from the following Prospectors: S/WR David Fernando (5-11, 165, Sr.), LB/RB Tanner Morgan (6-1, 200, Sr.), S/QB Roy Machuca (5-9, 175, Sr.), LB/OL Tyler Bivens (5-9, 205, Sr.), LB/RB Harrison Pomeroy (5-9, 200, Sr.), DL/OL John LaChapelle (6-0, 260, Jr.), S/QB Jon Converse (5-9, 165, Jr.) and DB/WR Jared Kraps (5-9, 160, Jr.).

Also finishing at 7-4 last year were the **RAYMOND KELLIS** Cougars, who were bounced out of the 4A-1 playoffs by eventual finalist Sabino. It was a sour ending to a fine season for Coach Jason Golden and his guys.





Coach Palmer is just beginning his third year as head coach at SHS; he currently has a 9-9 record.






5A-1 State Championship Bracket




5A-2 State Championship Bracket




4A-1 State Championship Bracket




