

Disappointing in 2008, ASU Ready For Better '09 Campaign!

From 10-3 in 2007 to 5-7 in 2008. Coach Dennis Erickson and his Sun Devils are searching for redemption in 2009, after Arizona State fell far short of expectations last fall.

Injuries certainly played a role. But last year's edition of Sun Devil Football demonstrated some glaring weaknesses that Erickson and his staff are still working to overcome. It appears the last two recruiting classes have substantially increased the talent level on campus, so will the Devils be much improved?

That Sun Devil defense looks good on paper. Solid veterans like Dexter Davis, Mike Nixon, Travis Goethel and Gerald Munns. Emerging stars like Lawrence Guy, James Brooks, Jamaar Jarrett, Shelly Lyons and Brandon Magee. Skilled newcomers like Corey Adams, William Sutton, Dean DeLeone, Vontaze Burfict, Matt Tucker and Osahon Irabor.

For the first time in many years, ASU appears to have everything you need to stop the other guys – size, speed, depth and the desire to be great.

It all starts with Davis, a 6-2, 255-pound senior defensive end with career totals of 113 tackles and 27.5 sacks. Barring injury, he should be one of the better speed rushers in the country. The remaining starters up front should be Brooks (6-5, 278) or Jarrett (6-5, 268) at the other defensive end, as well as Guy (6-5,

293) and Saia Falahola (6-1, 298) at the tackles. Guy is a force to be reckoned with, having earned Freshman All-America honors last year.

Newcomers DeLeone (6-2, 245), Adams (6-3, 308) and Sutton (6-1, 285) will push for playing time. Unfortunately, defensive tackle Otis Jones suffered an ACL tear in the spring and is out for the 2009 season; he was really starting to play well.

Others to watch on the defensive front are Jonathan English (6-0, 282), Jamarr Robinson (6-2, 247) and Bo Moos (6-0, 288). English is returning from a knee injury and is in great shape. He could press for an increased role over previous seasons.

The linebacking corps figures to be the backbone of the defense. There are battletested veterans and youngsters with tremendous upside. Moving the likes of Nixon (6-2, 224), Goethel (6-3, 237) and Munns (6-4, 242) out of the lineup won't be easy, but Lyons (6-2, 225), Magee (5-11, 226), Burfict (6-3, 245), Oliver Aaron (6-0, 205) and Derall Anderson (6-3, 223) are just too good not to play at least part of

the time. Lyons, Magee, Aaron and Anderson are sophomores, while Burfict arrives in Tempe as the most highly-decorated freshman recruit in Sun Devil history. As you may know, Lyons, Magee and Burfict are all former high school teammates at powerhouse Corona Centennial High School in Southern California. All three are very special players.

The secondary also has more depth than in prior campaigns, especially at cornerback. The starters could be Omar Bolden (5-10, 195) and Terell Carr (5-9, 177), although senior Pierre Singfield (5-11, 196) and sophomore Josh Jordan (6-1, 173) are worthy contenders.

Redshirt freshman Deveron Carr (5-11, 184) and newcomers LeQuan Lewis (5-10, 193) and Osahon Irabor (5-10, 178) will also battle for playing time. Lewis is among the fastest players on the team and is a highly-regarded JC product.

The Devils will have new safeties, since both Troy Nolan and Rodney Cox used up their eligibility. Sophomore Clint Floyd (5-10, 198) and senior Ryan McFoy (6-1, 209) head into fall camp atop the depth chart, but watch for redshirt fresh-

man Keelan Johnson (6-0, 199), senior Jarell Holman (6-0, 200), junior Max Tabach (6-2, 205) and true freshman Matt Tucker (6-1, 197) to be in the thick of things.

Offensively, the Sun Devils will have a new quarterback, a large contingent of unproven running backs, quite a group of receivers and a more experienced line eager to make up for past sins.

Of course, Rudy Carpenter is gone, so either senior Danny Sullivan (6-4, 242), sophomore Sampson Szakacsy (6-4, 205) or true freshman Brock Osweiler (6-8, 237) will be taking the snaps for ASU. Sullivan should begin the season as the number one guy. He possesses a strong arm, but very little experience. Szakacsy could play; he can throw the pigskin, but is also very quick and could give the Devils a different look. If the first two can't get the job done, Erickson could always turn things over to Osweiler, who finished high school early last year, so he could attend ASU and participate in spring practice. He's an impressive athlete.

The running backs did not have a good year at all in 2008. In fact, Demetri Nance (5-10, 218) led with just 410 yards on the ground. This year, Nance could lose his job to sophomore Ryan Bass (5-9, 205), redshirt freshman James Morrison (5-11, 219), senior Shaun DeWitty (6-2, 210), senior Jarrell Woods (5-10, 215) or true freshman Cameron Marshall (5-11, 200). The ball-carrying duties will most likely be shared, but don't be surprised if youngsters like Bass, Morrison and

Marshall begin to dominate. Erickson needs at least one of the bunch to step forward and get the job done.

The wideouts are due for a much better season too. Seniors Chris McGaha (6-1, 199), Kyle Williams (5-10, 186), junior Kerry Taylor (6-0, 197), sophomores Gerell Robinson (6-4, 220), T.J. Simpson (6-1, 189) and redshirt freshman A.J. Pickens (5-10, 172) should put up some big numbers.

McGaha is healthy once again; he has posted 112 receptions for 1,569 yards and five scores in his collegiate career.

Williams has great speed and just needs to be more consistent; he has career numbers of 52 catches for 811 yards and 10 TDs. Taylor began the 2008 season very strongly, but tailed off sharply. The Devils need him to be a positive force every game. And Robinson has worked so hard to become the player most everyone believes he will be.

It'll be tight end by committee once again. There's Jovon Williams (6-4, 225), back to contribute what he can as a senior. Dan Knapp (6-5, 258) is really good, but was hurt a year ago and may struggle to regain his form. Stanley Malamala (6-3, 267) is a fine blocker, but not much of a threat to grab many passes. Steven Figueroa (6-4, 251) is coming back from an injury-filled freshman year, while true freshmen Max Smith (6-2, 250) and Chris Coyle (6-2, 235) try to figure out where they fit in.

Ah, the offensive front. Honors candidate Shawn Lavaua (6-3, 305) has shifted to left tackle and there's no doubt he's the team leader up front. Jon Hargis (6-3, 312) has moved inside to play left guard and he should be better there. Garth Garhart (6-1, 302) has won the center position; he shows promise. On the right side, the favorites to start are guard Zach Schlink (6-4, 331) and tackle Tom Njunge (6-5, 272).

Others likely to see action are Matt Hustad (6-5, 292), Mike Marcisz (6-5, 298) and Adam Tello (6-3, 290).

Don't forget the kicking game. Junior Thomas Weber, who has merely connected on 43 of 50 field goal attempts and averaged 40.5 yards per punt, is among the best in college football.





Well, not a whole lot changed in 2008! The Hamilton Huskies and the Brophy Broncos continued their domination of "big school" football, meeting in the 5A-1 finale.

Hamilton walked away with the crown last year. Brophy in 2007. Hamilton in 2006. Brophy in 2005. Hamilton in 2004. Hamilton in 2003.

What will 2009 bring? Can Corona,

Chandler, Red Mountain or maybe Mountain View dethrone these two powerhouses?

The favorite has to be **HAMILTON**. Coach Steve Belles returns 31 lettermen, including 13 starters, from last year's 13-1 title team. Overall, Belles is 38-3 in his three years at the helm for the Huskies.

Senior Devon Carrington (6-2, 200), senior Zach Bauman (5-10, 210) and jun-

ior Christian Westerman (6-5, 290) are top-flight performers.

Carrington is a very highly-rated strong safety who has given Stanford University an oral commitment to attend school and play football beginning next fall. He'll definitely lead the Hamilton defense this year.

Bauman is a hard-nosed running back who – barring injury – figures to put

some big rushing numbers on the board this fall.

Westerman could very well become the most highly recruited offensive linemen in the history of our state. He's a remarkable player who has impressed so many people in his short prep career. When Westerman signs a letter of intent in 2011, it'll be a happy day for some college coach.

Others to watch among the 13 returning regulars are RB Michael Allen (5-11, 180, Sr.), DL Tevin Hood (6-1, 290, Sr.), QB Travis Dean (6-0, 180, Sr.), DB Cedric Parker (6-0, 170, Jr.), WR Steven Hansen (5-9, 170, Sr.), OL Gerard Ingallina (6-1, 245, Sr.), OL Justin LaLonde (6-0, 235, Sr.), S/LB Tyler Rutt (6-0, 190, Jr.), WR Ethan Kipilii (6-0, 170, Sr.) and LB/P Ben Peters (6-2, 220, Sr.).

Coach Gary Venturo has spent 23 years as the head coach at **CORONA DEL SOL**. On paper, he has an excellent team this year!

It all starts with Chase Cartwright, a 6-3, 210-pound senior who excels at quarterback and defensive back. Cartwright should be among the elite signal-callers in the state this year.

He'll have honors candidate Michael Lange (5-11, 195), Alan Stitt (5-10, 170) and Austin Crothers (5-10, 175) to carry the pigskin, while the versatile Kyle Benson (6-3, 215, Sr.) should be a good target at tight end.

Benson is better known for his superior work at linebacker, where he helped guide the Aztecs to a 9-3 record in 2008. Other receivers include Billy Johnson (5-10, 160), Chris Owan (5-10, 160), Stone Letoi (5-10, 165), Jake Buntrock (6-1, 175) and Josh Von Wallwordan (6-3, 170).

There's also plenty of muscle in the trenches, namely Todd Peat (6-3, 270), JP Dyament (6-3, 235), Kyle Homewood (6-3, 235), Zac Jubie (6-2, 260), Grant Shidawara (5-10, 230), Andre Lepe (6-1, 210) and Mark Kinney (6-1, 190).

Von Wallwordan will handle the kicking chores.

Head coach Scooter Molander really has **BROPHY PREP** on a roll. In fact, his 45-10 mark over four years (with two state crowns) is unparalleled in school history. The Broncos finished 11-4 in 2008.

If senior scatback Max Leonesio (6-1, 185) has anything to say about it, more success is just around the corner. In a rebuilding year, Leonesio ran wild, accounting for nearly 2,100 yards and 25 TDs last time out.

Additional skill-position players back in uniform include TE A.J. Steimel (6-3, 235), WR Scott Robson (5-8, 170), WR Max Eller (6-1, 185) and S/K Alex Garoutte (6-2, 190) – all seniors.

The leader in the offensive front is center Hank Jenkins, a 6-0, 260-pound bruiser. Coach Molander will have Brophy in the hunt again this season.

CHANDLER has been right on the edge of becoming one of the state's elite teams in recent years. Will this be the year Coach Jim Ewan and his Wolves reach the title game or even win it all? Could be, but that's why we play the games!

Headliners include RB Taylor Walstad (6-0, 205) and OT William Poehls (6-7, 295) – both seniors. Walstad has given ASU a verbal commitment to continue his education and athletic career in Tempe, while Poehls finished fourth in the state heavyweight wrestling championships last year.

But the task at hand for both standouts is to help lead Chandler to a run deep into the playoffs in the months ahead. And they'll have plenty of help.

Either senior Kyle Young (6-2, 175) or junior Brett Hundley (6-4, 210) will direct the offensive attack. Both are capable signal callers. The most polished receivers appear to be seniors Jereme Morris (5-9, 175) and Byrce Wood (6-0, 180).

Morris and Wood will be key factors in the secondary.

Another East Valley school – **RED MOUNTAIN** – is certainly worth watching. It's true the Mountain Lions were down a bit last year (7-6), but Coach Jim Jones has a talented and deep senior class on hand as the '09 season begins.

An amazing 45 letterwinners return from last year's varsity. And graduates from an undefeated JV (8-0) are also ready for the challenges ahead.

Super-quick RB Derek Molina, a 5-8, 175-pound senior, is a playmaker. He should be among the very best rushers again this year. His backfield mates will be FB Ben Betz (6-1, 230), RB Dominic Smith (5-10, 180), RB David Barragan (5-10, 170), QB John O'Connor (6-3, 175) and RB Corey Martinez (5-10, 175).

Tight end Craig Frum (6-3, 215) and WR Ian McFadden (6-0, 180) lead a fine crop of receivers, which also includes TE Jason Lane (5-11, 175), WR Aaron Palmera (5-11, 170), WR Tony Navarette (6-1, 165), TE Austin Reinholz (6-0, 175), TE Andrew Holden (6-0, 185), WR Nick Fraser (6-0, 165) and WR Nick Griffin (5-0, 170).

The dominant players up front figure to be OG/DL Taylor Wood (6-2, 230), DL Jake Phipps (6-4, 220), OL/LB Evan Nienas (6-1, 200), OL/DL Joe Hoff (5-8, 195), OL Cole Ficklin (6-4, 250), OL Chris Hayes (6-1, 240), DL Jerrell Porter (5-10, 230), OL Justin Sinsabaugh (5-11, 200), OL Matt Greb (6-0, 220), OL Diego Ortiz (6-0, 200) and OL/DL Ryan Collins (6-0, 195).

Gone are the likes of Devon Kennard, Marcus Washington, Cole Pembroke, Danny Mullarkey, Casey Bolina and friends at **DESERT VISTA**, where Coach Dan Hinds has the Thunder pointing towards the 2009 campaign.

It's true a great deal of talent has departed via graduation, but DVHS should be fine. Twenty-five lettermen are back from a good 8-3 team.

Foremost among the returnees are RB/DB Anders Battle, (6-0, 170), RB/LB Anthony Kereluk (5-10, 215), QB Cody Sokol (6-2, 185), WR/DB Ryne Rezal (5-8, 170) and OL/DL Mike Flaster (6-2, 225) – all seniors.

BASHA will be looking to rebound to its 2006 form, when the Bears advanced to the 5A-1 state semifinals. Coach Tim McBurney's guys were a respectable 6-5 last year, but are working for even better results. Twenty-six letterwinners return and graduates of a 7-2 JV are also available.

Coach Jim Rattay and his **CESAR CHAVEZ** Champions are becoming competitive at the 5A-1 Division. He certainly has some great athletes who figure to get better and better.

MESA could make some noise in 2009, under the able leadership of Coach Kelley Moore. Although the Jackrabbits were a modest 6-5 last year, Moore does have 21 varsity returnees.

He anticipates his best performers will be QB Kyler Fackrell (6-4, 205), DT Javier Gonzalez (5-11, 230), SS Jaymen Green (5-8, 150), FB Devontae Kellybrow (5-11, 200), OLB Kolter Anderson (6-3, 210), CB Ely Lozano (5-11, 165), Eric McNeil (6-0, 160), K/P Tyler Ryan (6-0, 165), OT Dallin King (6-4, 235), OG Robert Bausick (5-9, 220) and OG Iutalanoa Toutoi (5-9, 245) – all seniors.

If you want to see a great tight end play this season, you'll need to get out to a **ST. MARY'S** game. Although the Knights aren't favored to take state honors, senior TE/DE Josh Fulton (6-4, 240) will be among the state's finest individual players. He's committed to play for ASU next year. Fulton has good hands, runs solid routes and possesses 4.8 speed.

Coach Eddy Zubey hopes to parlay 15 starters (in addition to Fulton) into a winning season. St. Mary's was 3-7 last fall in Zubey's first year on the job.

Lending a hand will be RB/DB RJ McGill (5-9, 175, Sr.), WR/DB Tregg Waters (6-1, 190, Sr.), RB/DB Orange Mooney (5-10, 180, So.), OL Diego Arriaga (6-0, 260, Sr.), DL Kameron Gregory (6-1, 260, Sr.), OL Tommy Apodaca (6-2, 275, Jr.), WR/DB Patrick Barefield (5-8, 155, Jr.) and RB/DB LaRon Tarkington (5-9, 175, So.).

This is a team with an exceptional player and plenty of young talent with good speed.

This year **SKYLINE** is joining its fellow Mesa schools in the 5A-1 ranks, after participating in 5A-2 football for several years. We think the Coyotes will be fine. Coach Peter Jonovich has 17 varsity vets back from his 8-4 squad of a year ago.



Also making the list for Mendez are senior bruisers like OL/DL John Holtz (6-0, 215), OL/DL Dylan Walker (6-1, 225), OL/DL Byron Schlechty (6-2, 265), TE/DL Deandre Barnes (6-1, 215), FB/LB Joseph Rodriguez (5-8, 180) and FB/LB Chris Lopez (5-8, 170). The Warriors have a chance to get over the .500 mark, if their 24 returning lettermen play well in '09.





Centennial Headed Towards Four-Peat Can Westview, MDN or Chaparral End This Run?

Four years ago, the 5A Conference split into two divisions – 5A-1 and 5A-2. In 2005, Coach Richard Taylor and his **CENTENNIAL** Coyotes played in the 5A-2 finale, losing to the North Canyon Rattlers. They haven't lost to a 5A-2 opponent since, capturing three straight state titles in the process.

In fact, Centennial has fashioned 14-0, 13-1 and 14-0 seasons in 2006, 2007 and 2008, respectively. The Coyotes' only loss was a 35-18 decision to 5A-1 powerhouse Hamilton two years ago. And they defeated eventual 5A-1 champ Hamilton, 35-16, last year.

Just remarkable! Congratulations to an outstanding football program at Centennial.

Can the Coyotes make it four in a row? We'll find out soon enough. Coach Taylor will escort his guys to Reno in late August to battle the defending Nevada "big school" champion McQueen Lancers in this year's Sollenberger Classic. Should be a good matchup.

McQueen and the rest of Centennial's foes this year will have to contend with a dynamite offensive line, as well as plenty of speed at the skill positions.

Senior Nick Rowland (6-4, 305), Dylan Lusk (6-2, 301) and Junior Nieves (6-3, 306) are truly special players. Rowland could emerge as Arizona's finest performer this year and he's definitely headed to a big-time university program next year. Lusk and Nieves aren't far behind – excellent anchors up front.

Also contributing for Coach Taylor are C/DT Roc Lopez (5-11, 210), DL Dylan Eastridge (5-9, 250), OL/DL Luis Gardea (5-11, 255), OL/DL Spencer Ropte (6-2, 220), OL/DL Charles Henggerler (6-3, 275) and DE/P Ryan Leslie (6-0, 206) – all seniors.

Offensively, the QB is Dain McFarland (6-0, 185) and the chief ball carrier is Anthony Hughes (5-10, 200). They're plenty dangerous, especially behind that line.

Also keep an eye on TE/MLB Austin Arias (6-0, 225), TE/OLB Austin Garday (6-0, 209), WR/CB Kyle Coffey (5-10, 175), WR/CB Sean Dumdie (6-0, 190), WR/SS Matt Baugh (6-1, 187), WR/S Jacob Callahan (5-9, 170), TB/SS Aaron Smolinski (5-9, 177) and TB/CB Bryce Wright (5-9, 180).

Altogether, the Coyotes return 34 lettermen from last year's undefeated bunch.

If not for the excellence of Centennial, Coach Jeff Bowen and his team at **WEST-VIEW** would be receiving a lot more attention. After all, the Knights have reached the 5A-2 finale for each of the last two years before bowing to Centennial.

Bowen should field another contender in 2009, thanks to the presence of seniors like

QB/CB Jourdan Grandon, a 6-0, 180-pounder with 4.5 speed. He's very good.

Besides Grandon, Westview has 29 more letterwinners back in uniform as well as some promising youngsters from a perfect (9-0) junior varsity.

The trio of TE/MLB Eric Ramsey (6-0, 220, Sr.), junior C/DE Brennan Bowen (6-0, 265, Jr.) and FB/LB Carlton Williams (5-9, 195, Jr.) has already won all-state recognition and are being counted on to enjoy big '09 outings.

Other returning regulars are SE/DB Nate McOwen (5-10, 160, Sr.), OT/TE/DE Brandon Rediger (6-2, 220, Sr.), OG/DT Willie Chaffee (5-8, 200, Sr.), OT/LB Emil Romero (5-11, 205, Sr.), SE/FS Joe Espinoza (5-11, 160, Sr.) and RB/CB Levi Childress (5-8, 150, Jr.).

Head mentor Roy Lopez has another good roster of players at MARCOS DE NIZA. He's particularly excited about seniors Ramon Abreu (5-11, 185), Justin Rodriguez (6-3, 190) and Zach Schira (6-2, 180).

Abreu was recently offered by ASU; he's a speedy two-way star at running back and linebacker. And the Padres passing attack just might feature QB Schira to WR Rodriguez.

Others to watch include WR Tevin Newell (6-0, 180, Sr.), OL/DL Roy Garcia (6-2, 250, Sr.), OL/DL Billy Rono (6-4, 295, Sr.), RB/DB Dominic Sotelo (5-6, 160, Jr.), WR/DB JeRyan Butler (5-9, 160, Jr.), WR/DB Martwan

Shivers has terrific speed and should be especially effective on returns. "He'll run the ball with Abreu," says Lopez. "He's our best all-around athlete."

Coach Lopez guided his guys to an 11-2 mark last year, including a spot in the 5A-2 semifinals. "We're working extremely hard to be one of the top programs in the state," says Lopez.

This is a big year for the coaches, players and fans at **CHAPARRAL**. Clearly, the Firebirds have been one of the best programs at the 4A-1 level in the past decade, winning state championships in 1999, 2000 and 2002 before finishing second last year. Now Coach Charlie Ragle and his squad will attack 5A-2 competition with 25 varsity veterans back from last season's 12-2 unit and performers from an unblemished (9-0) JV team.

Dwayne Garrett (6-0, 190) is a team leader at running back. He's quick (4.5) and should

have a big senior year after running for 1,963 vards and 27 scores in '08.

Senior bookends Cole Tyree (5-10, 180) and Danny Trittler (5-10, 185) will lend support at running back and wide receiver, respectively.

This year's club will definitely miss the likes of all-staters Craig Roh and Taylor Lewan, who both opted to continue their careers at the University of Michigan. But the Firebirds will still have some big and motivated players in the trenches, such as C Joe Zurek (6-0, 185), DE Chris Fox (6-3, 220), LT Jacob Ehm (6-6, 255), RT Andrew Gustafson (6-6, 265) and DT Xavier McDonald (6-2, 240).

Junior safety Colby Targun (5-10, 180) and senior backer Chris Arnold (6-0, 210) should be heavy contributors on defense.

'We should be solid contenders in 5A-2," says Ragle. "Though we're moving up, we have plenty of young talent and should be in the mix at the end."

How about Tony Tabor's team at DESERT MOUNTAIN? This is Coach Tabor's fourth year with the Wolves, so this year's seniors are the first class he had as freshmen. And it's a good group.

The Wolves were 5-5 last year, finishing third in the region. Twenty-nine lettermen return, including 14 starters. The headliner is two-way senior lineman Tyeler Davison, a 6-2, 280-pounder. He's formidable, especially at noseguard.

And Davison has plenty of friends who'd like to contribute, namely TE/DE Charlie Andrews (6-3, 235), QB Kevin Radcliffe (6-0, 180), REC/S Kyle Tokasey (6-0, 170), REC/CB Dakota D'Angelo (6-0, 180), RB/LB Shane Williams (5-9, 185), OG/NG Josh Simon (6-0, 220), REC/S Mike Amlin (6-0, 180, Jr.) and REC/CB Matt Delvalle (5-10, 180).

Good things are happening at BOULDER CREEK, where Coach Dan Friedman is beginning his third year at the helm. He has 19 letterwinners back from his 2008 unit that finished 9-3 on the year. There's 10 starters in that group and plenty of good, young talent up from a 9-0 junior varsity.

Junior scatbacks Phillip Bayus (5-7, 165) and Mike Contreras (5-7 155) will run behind the likes of OL Mario Lugo (5-10, 210, Sr.), OL Brandon Deip (5-11, 220, Sr.) and TE Zack Brown (6-2, 215, Jr.) when the Jaguars go to the rushing attack.

Brown and WB Jordan Coleman (5-6, 150, Sr.) should be the leading receivers, while LB Taylor Reber (5-11, 185, Jr.) and DB Joe Kupiszewski (5-10, 180, Sr.) will pace the BCHS defense.

Another "new kid on the block" starting to make its presence felt is PINNACLE. The Pioneers were great in 2007, but fell off a bit in 2008, winding up at 5-6. Watch for better days this time out.

Coach Dana Zupke's 2009 edition has 13 starters suiting up - seven on offense and six on defense. He figures to be the most heavily recruited player in the Grand Canyon State this year.

But the cupboard is far from bare. Once again, Sanders & Co. has some terrific talent at the line of scrimmage. the Year last season for his gamebreaking work for the Panthers.

Even with the considerable loss of players like Miles, Jeremy Dang and Vinnie Spano to graduation, Peoria is loaded. Coach Doug Clapp has 29 returning lettermen from his 11-2 varsity squad and some talent on the way from his 8-1 junior varsity unit.

There's depth at the skill positions, especially in the passing game. Wide receivers K.J. Bowen (5-11, 175, Sr.), Javonte Fluellen (6-1, 190, Sr.), and Austin Cundiff (5-10, 180, Jr.) should have plenty of big games if QB Caleb Gillispie (6-2, 205, Jr.) can do a good job of delivering the football. He's plenty capable.

Phoenix Metro 4A-1 Top 15

The primary running backs could be Joseph Tanis (6-1, 190) and A.J. Taylor (5-9, 195) – both seniors.

Defensively, Clapp anticipates major contributions from DE Haisaun Adams (6-1, 220, Sr.), LB Dylan Contreras (6-1, 220, Jr.), FS Steven Trujillo (6-0, 170, Sr.) and LB/DE Darius Jones (5-10, 205, Sr.).

Clapp's coaching record now stands at a sparkling 208-69-6 in 23 years at Peoria. His Panthers have always been good and were one of the most dominant 4A teams in the 1980s and 1990s, winning state crowns in '86, '87 and '94 and reaching the finales in '88 and '90. This 2009 team has a great chance to add to that rich Peoria tradition.

Coach Mike Gibbons has a contender this year at McCLINTOCK. It's true the Chargers were 5-6 in 2008, following a 5-7 campaign in 2007, Gibbons' first year as head mentor at MHS.

We expect the Chargers to be well above the .500 mark this year, thanks to the return of 22 lettermen, including eight starters.

The cream of the crop for Coach Gibbons should be RB/LB Hayden Tippett (5-11, 215, Sr.), TE/LB Ricky Astoria (6-0, 190, Sr.), OL/DL Brian Aberle (6-0, 205, Sr.), RB/DL Jabril Gipson (5-10, 240, Jr.), RB/LB Austin Williams (5-9, 185, Sr.), TE/LB Connor Ettsity (5-10, 190, Sr.), OL/DL Irmiyaa Johnson (6-0, 190, Sr.), QB/DB Brent Davis (6-1, 175, Sr.) and OL/DL Dominique Sordia (6-2, 255, Sr.).

Rich Milligan doesn't have the services of all-stater Shane McCullen at **APACHE JUNCTION** any longer; he's now at ASU playing for Coach Dennis Erickson. But Coach Milligan still should have a very competitive team, thanks to the return of 15 lettermen, including seven regulars, from the 2008 Prospectors, who finished 8-4 a year ago.

Big Cy Maughmer (6-2, 285) will anchor both lines from his offensive guard and nose tackle spots.

He'll receive plenty of assistance from QB/LB Nate Scola (5-11, 210), RB/LB Terry Eytchesen (5-6, 185), OT/DE Stepha Hughes (6-1, 195), OG/DT Shane Smith (6-1, 245) and WR/DB Derek Hoffmann (6-0, 170) – all seniors.

Next up are the **PRESCOTT** Badgers, under the guidance of veteran coach Lou Beneitone. Things are looking good for PHS this fall; seven starters return from last season's 7-4 team. The '08 JV posted six wins in eight tries.

Beneitone expects standout play from WR/DB Aaron Gronwald (5-11, 160), RB/LB Joey Mancha (5-10, 170), OL/DL Jr. Vicente (6-0, 255), QB/DB Matt Groff (6-0, 175), WR/DB Seth Huffman (5-11, 150), TE/DE Natt Wittler (6-3, 220) and OL/DL Vince Colianni (5-11, 190) – all twelfth-graders.

"Ian Juede will be one of the top players in both the Western Sky Region and in 4A-1 football," says **SHADOW MOUN-TAIN** Head Coach Josh Sekoch.

Juede is a 5-8, 175-pound junior with 4.6 speed. He'll certainly receive playing time in the secondary, as well as at wide receiver and possibly quarterback. Juede will do his best to push the Matadors past last year's 3-7 record and towards the postseason.

Coach Sekoch also expects solid performances from OT Cameron Bailey (6-4, 240, Jr.), TE/LB Wes Sorenson (6-4, 200, Jr.), OL/DL Austin Hampton (6-0, 200, Jr.), WR Erwin Jones Jr. (5-10, 160, Jr.), TE/DL Mitch Murray (5-10, 200, Sr.), QB/DB Chaz Cronovich (5-7, 160, Jr.), QB Chase Merrill (5-10, 180, So.), OT Patrick Bialy (6-0, 250, Sr.) and OL Jeremiah Hill (6-4, 260, So.).

We spoke earlier of the great tradition at Peoria High School. For those longtime prep football fans, you'll recognize the name of Will Babb as being a big part of that tradition. Well, it's Coach Babb now and he's hard at work trying to establish something special at SUNRISE MOUNTAIN. The Mustangs suffered through a tough '08 season (1-9), but, with 16 starters and a total of 22 letterwinners back for another year, watch SMHS improve this time out.

RB/LB Tyler Brown (6-1, 205), OL/DL Preston Brooksly (6-5, 260) and RB/DB Scott Nichols (5-10, 180) – all seniors – will set the pace.

Also lending a hand will be TE/LB Jordan Michael (6-2, 225, Sr.), FB/OLB Mike Murrillo (5-10, 190, Sr.), WR/DB Taylor Haines (5-10, 170, Sr.), OL/LB Shane Johnson (6-0, 215, Jr.), OL/DL Ricky Gray (6-2, 245, Sr.), DB Dillon Hester (6-0, 185, Sr.) and DL Ray Brazil (6-0, 255, Sr.).

Returning all-region performers Dallas Sandberg (6-5, 300), Devin Begay (6-0, 230) and Mychael Eikenberry (5-9, 220) are among the 13 returning lettermen at **BRADSHAW MOUNTAIN**. Sandberg and Begay are both offensive linemen, while Eikenberry is a powerful fullback. All three are seniors.

Also returning for Coach Chuck Apap, who guided the Bears to a 5-7 record last fall, are RB/OLB Jeremiah Hernandez (5-8, 170, Sr.), DT Joshua Ruda (5-10, 230, Sr.), WR James Reyes (6-4, 175, Jr.), C Shon Do (5-10, 160, Jr.), QB Tyler Audsley (5-9, 150, So.), DB Kevin Wallace (6-0, 150, Jr.), DB Chase Sullins (6-4, 190, Sr.), OLB John Kelley (5-8, 155, Jr.), DT Eric Jolley (6-3, 190, Jr.), OG Zack Smith (5-11, 195, Sr.), C Brady Cabral (6-3, 280, Jr.), and NG Marcus Bronson (5-11, 301, So.).

We're not quite sure how QUEEN CREEK will fare this season. The Bulldogs are moving up to 4A-1 competition. Coach Curt LeBlanc's crew returns 18 lettermen – but just three starters – from an 8-4 unit. The '08 JV was undefeated (8-0).

So it's more likely than not that QCHS

will do just fine in '09, especially after the Bulldogs make the early-season adjustment to 4A-1 play. LeBlanc is relying most heavily on these players for standout performances: DT Layne Bourgeous (6-4, 250, Sr.), QB Adam Brzeczek (6-0, 170, Jr.), TB Nick Arnold (5-9, 160, Sr.), CB Marcus Wilkins (6-0, 180, Sr.), DE Tommy Cawood (6-1, 190, Sr.), WR Kendal Augustin (6-1, 180, Sr.), DE Trace Bowman (5-11, 175, Sr.), OT Matt Holmes (6-2, 210, Sr.), DT Chad Dilzer (5-11, 240, Sr.), K DJ Lechner (5-11, 165, Sr.) and RB Billy Gregoire (6-0, 180, So.).

That brings us to the **SUNNYSLOPE** Vikings, under the direction of third-year coach Tim Mayfield. His club improved from 2-8 in 2007 to 7-4 in 2008. And, with seven regulars returning on offense and five more on defense, this could be another very solid season for the Vikings.

"Our strength should be our experience," says Mayfield. "Our weakness is our size. We work hard in the weight room and in offseason conditioning, but our linemen have a tough time against bigger players."

Sunnyslope's best returnees are RB/LB Jesse McGrath (5-11, 210, Sr.), QB Ben Maraz (6-1, 205, Jr.), WR/DB Michael Bolinger (5-10, 160, Sr.), WR/LB Grady Callaghan (5-10, 165, Sr.), OL/DL Andrew Sapozink (6-1, 230, Sr.), OL/DL Sam Montini (5-11, 195, Sr.).

Among the newcomers, watch the play of WR/DB Ashton Young (6-1, 190), RB/LB Denny Robertson (5-11, 175) and WR/LB Michael Stoeber (5-11, 175) – all juniors.

Coach Jason Golden looks to have a good group at RAYMOND KELLIS, where an impressive 32 lettermen are back and ready for kickoff. Eleven of that bunch are returning starters and Golden also has members of last season's 7-1 JV now ready to contribute at the varsity level.

Some of his best players, like Traveon Freeman, Chad Snider and Erik Sidney, are senior skill-position athletes. Freeman, for example, is a 5-10, 175-pound running back with 4.7 speed.

Snider (5-10, 185) is a QB, while Sidney (6-2, 185) plays wide receiver and also handles the punting chores.

Others to watch are DE Greg Fritz (6-3, 205, Sr.), OT Jessie Meza (6-4, 275, Sr.), C Nick Garfinkle (6-1, 250, Jr.), NG Matt Mireles (5-10, 210, Jr.), FS Tyler Jackson (5-11, 160, Sr.), OG Jose Loera (6-2, 280, Jr.) and CB Quantae Whiters (5-11, 170, Jr.).

Mark Smith is beginning his third year

as head coach for his alma mater, the MOON VALLEY Rockets. He welcomes back 11 letterwinners from his team which recorded five wins in 11 games in '08. Smith and Co. are looking for a .500+ effort in '09.

Foremost among the veterans are RB/LB Cora Deal (5-9, 185), OL/LB Mike Dewitt (5-11, 200), WR/LB Raney Gomez (5-8, 170) and TE/DE Zach Spacler (6-2, 210) – all seniors.

Up from the 6-2 junior varsity are the likes of QB/LB Kieh George (6-1, 185, Jr.), WR/DB Andrew Kohl (6-1, 165, Jr.), WR/DB Carlos Chiang (5-9, 160, Jr.), OL/DL Vi Teofilo (6-2, 245, Jr.), OL/DL Jon Rudnick (5-9, 210, Sr.) and OL/DL Derek Geffs (6-2, 220, Sr.).

A promising newcomer is WR/DB Sherrode Simmons, a 6-2, 175-pound senior

Like Moon Valley, **APOLLO** also closed out the 2008 campaign with a 5-6 slate and is looking for more success in '09. Coach Zack Threadgill has 20 lettermen, including 13 starters, returning to help get the job done.

It all starts with WR/CB Braden Sparks (5-9, 167), RB/CB Kyran Smith (5-9, 168) and OL/DL AJ Cavazos (6-0, 220). These seniors are very capable leaders.

Other mainstays are QB/LB Zachary Wilson (6-1, 192, Jr.), TE/DL Chrisdean Ayiyi (6-1, 184, Jr.), TE/DL Christian Still (6-3, 210, Sr.), TE/LB Jose Torres (6-3, 195, Sr.), WR Jon Macias (5-11, 161, Sr.), HB/LB Gabe Solomon (5-11, 175, Sr.), DL Nick Christ (5-8, 220, Sr.), RB/LB Jordan Griggs (6-2, 184, Jr.) and LB Aaron Barnett (5-9, 176, Jr.).

DYSART is yet another school with a 5-6 record from a year ago. Head man Josh Mitchell is beginning his third year leading the Demons, who improved from 1-9 in 2007 to that 5-6 mark in 2008.

"We will be young at the skill positions after graduating our top two rushers and our leading receiver," says Mitchell. "But we do return three offensive linemen, including second-team all-region offensive lineman Cody Harris. The Aztec offensive attack will feature FB/DE TiAndre Hunter (6-1, 215), RB/LB Damon Lacey (6-0, 215), WR/SS Billy Bushong (6-0, 190), RB/DB Blaine Griffin (5-9, 180) and QB Steven Plasencio (5-11, 160).

Paradise Valley, Notre Dame, Cactus Top Three in 4A-2 Trophy Run



The two-time defending state champs at the 4A-2 level are the Notre Dame Prep Saints. Newcomers to the classification – like Paradise Valley and Cactus – will certainly test Coach Scot Bemis and his club in 2009 (Paynter's Pics).

Coach Donnie Yantis has been the head man at **PARADISE VALLEY** for nine years, posting a 62-38 mark. After checking in at 9-3 in 2008, the Trojans could reach even higher status in 2009 as they join the 4A-2 competition.

PVHS has a polished senior quarter-back in Kevin Spain. This 6-2, 190-pounder completed 60% of his passes last season, throwing for 1,200 yards and 12 scores, with just two picks.

Yantis describes senior Jake Brown as, "one of the best two-way players in the state and a three-year starter for us." He plays running back and linebacker at 5-11 and 220 pounds.

The quickest Trojan is RB/LB Tyree

Parker (5-10, 215), who has tallied 2,600 yards rushing thus far in his terrific prep career.

Also lending a hand will be OG/LB Cyrus Way (6-0, 230, Sr.), TE/LB Travis Ramirez (6-0, 225, Sr.), TE/DE Austen Salazar (6-1, 245, Jr.) and OL/DL Joe Wylezik (6-2, 245, Sr.).

But don't expect **NOTRE DAME PREP** to give up its 4A-2 title without a rather large battle. The Saints have been near-perfect (27-1) the past two years in grabbing the top spot in this division.

Coach Scot Bemis should have another excellent squad; he welcomes back 28 letterwinners from his 14-0 outfit of a year ago.

One of the leaders – C/DT Blair Tushaus (6-3, 275) – has already made an oral commitment to play next year at Brigham Young University. It looks as though Tushaus may be out with a knee injury; if so, that will significantly hurt Notre Dame's prospects.

Bemis has a number of seniors, including QB Will King (6-5, 210), RB Devon Villarreal (5-11, 215), RB Jordan Geitz (5-11, 180), FB Jake Ely (5-10, 215), WR Skyler McCurdy (5-8, 155), WR Joe Verson (6-3, 180) and TE Brian Renfree (6-2, 215), to run his offense.

Besides Tushaus, Notre Dame's big boys are two-way linemen Ian Montague (6-2, 285, Jr.), Peter Igras (6-3, 230, Jr.), Dan Fischer (6-2, 240, Sr.) and Kevin Dogren (5-10, 215, Sr.).

The CACTUS Cobras, under the guidance of Larry Fetkenhier, are certainly worthy contenders. Coach Fetkenhier has guided his teams to a sparkling 236-68-3 record in 25 years at CHS. Of course, no one knows exactly how the 4A-2 Division will play out in 2009, but we expect the Cobras to be in the mix.

An impressive 26 lettermen – but only three starters – are back on the field after finishing 8-4 last fall. There's good experience and balance between the skill positions and both lines.

Pacing the Cactus offensive attack will be QB Brody Ray (5-11, 175), RB Allen Woods (6-0, 191) and WR Ryan Cosic (6-2, 179) – all seniors.

Up front, Fetkenhier expects senior Patrick Blanar (6-3, 283), senior Christian Williams (6-2, 267) and junior Ryan Nowicki (6-5, 271) to clear the way.

The prime stopper on defense – and maybe the Cobras' top returning player – is LB Josh Sydzyik, a 6-2, 228-pound senior.

Coach Jim Beall has done a nice job at **HIGLEY**, where the Knights always seem to be in the 4A-2 playoffs and almost won the whole thing in 2006.

He has a very representative team again this time out, with a dozen lettermen back from his 7-4 2008 bunch. Members of last season's fine JV (6-1-1) will also play a role.

Three of the best are REC/DB Kelvin Fisher (6-0, 175, Jr.), RB/DB Emmanuel Caro del Castillo (5-8, 160, Sr.) and OL/DL Jordan Davy (5-10, 200, Sr.). Fisher has 4.6 speed.

There is plenty of size in OL/DL AJ Porras (6-3, 220, Sr.), OL/DL Harrison Stone (6-2, 210, Sr.), OL/DL Zach Wellborn (5-10, 220, Sr.), OL/Dl James Hosobe (5-8, 200, Jr.) and TE/LB Ben Vaivao (6-0, 205, Sr.).

Senior Luke Magee will see action at both quarterback and in the secondary. He's a 5-8, 160-pounder.

Also in Coach Beall's plans are RB/LB TJ Mitchell (5-8, 115, Jr.), REC/LB Tomasz Barba (5-7, 160, Sr.) and RB/LB Damone Scott (5-10, 180, Sr.).

Coach Jim Ellison begins his second year at **ARCADIA** knowing he has one of the finest returning quarterbacks in Arizona high school football on his side.

The Titans did fairly well last year, reaching the playoffs before closing things out with a 7-5 ledger. Of course, QB Colby Kirkegaard (6-2, 180) was a big part of that. If this young man can put together a sensational senior campaign,

he just might land a Division I football scholarship in the months ahead.

He'll work with runners Pat Schrimsher (5-11, 205) and Jake Hirschi (5-7, 165), as well as primary receiver Joey Artigue (5-8, 165) – all seniors.

Bookends Jordan Christenson (5-10, 250) and Jerome Todechine (5-11, 240) will work in the trenches at tackle and center, respectively. Senior LB Connor McClain (5-10, 200) will join forces with Schrimsher to spark the Arcadia defense.

Altogether, 23 varsity veterans return, giving Ellison a solid foundation for a very good season.

GREENWAY has compiled a nifty 94-56 record with Mike Brown at the helm for 14 years. The Demons were good last year, finishing 10-3 and advancing to the 4A-2 semis before losing to eventual winner Notre Dame Prep.

A dozen varsity performers are back in uniform and Brown likes what he sees with players from last year's 8-0 junior varsity.

Headliners like QB/FS Chase Harpole (6-0, 180), QB/CB Daniel Rankin (6-3, 190), WR/DB Ryan Harper (6-2, 185) and OT/DE Mike Pawloski (6-3, 305) will vie for regional and state honors. All are twelfth-graders.

Also keep an eye on TB/CB Marshall Galbraith (5-7, 150, Sr.), OT/DT Josh Toose (6-7, 402, Jr.), OG/LB Josh Feldman (5-11, 228, Sr.), FB/LB Harrison Johnson (6-0, 190, Jr.) and WR/CB Ronnie Sellers (5-10, 150, Sr.).

From 4-7 in 2006, to 6-5 in 2007, to 11-2 in 2008. Very positive run for Coach B.J. Pasquel at **CORONADO**. Duplicating that '08 record and a trip to the 4A-2 state semifinals won't be easy for the Dons, with just seven returning starters on hand.

But it could happen, thanks to the outstanding play of superior athletes like OT/DE Sergio Arocha (6-1, 220, Sr.), QB/DE Alex Buya (6-3, 185, Jr.), OL/DB TJ Brown (5-11, 190, Sr.), WR/DB Colton Anderson (5-10, 155, Sr.), TE/LB Jairo Ibarra (5-10, 190, Sr.), WR/DB Kwame Webster (5-11, 155, Sr.), RB/DB Shawn Martin (5-9, 165, Sr.) and C/DL Jake Bissett (5-11, 180, Jr.).

After 33 years as a head coach at three schools in Indiana, Coach Rex Bowser heads into his second year as the head man at **SETON CATHOLIC**. The Sentinels prevailed in five of 11 contests in 2008. From that club, 11 regulars (17 lettermen) are back and figure heavily in Coach Bowser's plans.

Senior quarterback Justin Sieczkowski (6-3, 210) is highly regarded and will be

one of the better field generals in 4A football. And he's lucky enough to have some dependable targets in senior wideouts Trevor Cleisner (6-1, 175), Zac Awehder (6-1, 170) and Ken Whisenhunt (6-0, 170).

There's a first-rate running back in the form of senior Kyle Johnson (5-10, 180), who also doubles at linebacker on defense. The kicking chores will be handled by senior Michael Chavez (5-9, 140).

Junior Kevin McDonald (6-1, 259) and senior Zach Hendrickson (6-2, 230) are stalwarts on both sides of the line of scrimmage.

Steve Campbell has constructed a playoff contender at WILLIAMS FIELD, even though the Black Hearts' program is just a couple of years old.

An eye-opening 35 lettermen return for Coach Campbell, including a remarkable 20 starters. Ten seniors stand out. They are: RB/DB Brandon Warren (5-10, 185), MLB Dylon Koch (5-11, 200), QB/FS Nick Gaylord (6-1, 210), OT Andre Midence (6-2, 240), WR Aaron Hill (6-0, 170), FB/DT Larry Sandroliwi (6-0, 230), TE/LB Ryan Weybrecht (5-10, 190), TE/DE Deaton Wilson (6-1, 225), OG/DE Ryan Klienman (5-10, 205) and DB Eric Rewdon (5-11, 190).

Williams Field's varsity wound up 8-3, while the junior varsity won seven of eight games a year ago.

"We lost eight starters to injury last year," says **BUCKEYE** Head Coach Bobby Barnes. "If that happens again, it will be another five- or six-win season. If we stay healthy, we will be better than our ninewin team of 2007. This will be the fastest team I've ever had."

Eleven starters, paced by senior honors candidates Randy Hale Jr. (5-10, 165), David Banks (5-11, 165), Sammy Guerrero (5-11, 180) and Jaime Gastelum (6-0, 200), are back from last season's 5-5 team.

Hale is quick (4.6) and could see action at quarterback, running back and defensive back. Banks and Guerrero are topnotch wideouts and also play defensive back and linebacker, respectively.

Gastelum is a two-way star at fullback and defensive end.

Barnes is also relying on good play from WR/FS Derrick Jefferson (5-9, 160, Sr.), WR/DB Yogi Hale (5-7, 155, Jr.), C/DL Robert Rangel (5-10, 215, Sr.), OL Francisco Chavez (6-2, 285, Sr.), OL/DL Ricky Higuera (5-9, 230, Jr.), OL/DL Hunter King (6-1, 220, Jr.) and WR/DB Andrew Holden (5-10, 160, Sr.).

THUNDERBIRD has dropped down from 4A-1 to 4A-2 this year; it's unclear whether or not the Chiefs will fare better than the 3-7 slate they put together in '08.

Coach Brent Wittenwyler has 16 lettermen (nine starters) returning and hopes are high a better record is just around the corner.

Senior WR Ryan Cowles (5-11, 180) leads a fine corps of receivers, along with WR Peter Baroldy (6-1, 190, Sr.), WR Michael Daoust (6-0, 185, Sr.) and TE Vince Personne (6-1, 195, Sr.). The quarterback figures to be Josh Ganados (5-11, 175, Sr.).

Additional contributions should come from OG/LB Connor Magness (6-1, 200, Jr.), OL/DL Brandon Martin (6-1, 240, Jr.), OL/LB Chris Delgado (6-0, 215, Sr.), SS Joel Flores (5-10, 185, Sr.), OL/DL William Munda (5-10, 215, Sr.) and RB/DB Andy Pellistri (5-8, 170, Sr.).

Playing an independent schedule in 2008, **LIBERTY** posted a respectable 6-6 slate in its first year of varsity competition. From that club, which had sophomores and juniors, but no seniors, Coach Dan Filleman has 32 lettermen (and all 22 starters) back on campus.

It's a lot to ask, but the Lions just might be playoff-bound; we'll see how the year unfolds. Filleman's best players could be QB/DB Keegan Whipkey (6-0, 180, Sr.), WR/DB Kyle Benedict (5-10, 170, Sr.), RB/LB Jeff Haney (5-11, 180, Sr.), RB/LB Dan Mihelich (5-9, 185, Sr.), DE Mitchell Kullos (6-1, 195, Sr.), WR/S Manny Noriega (5-7, 165, Jr.), WR Branden Croteau (6-4, 175, Jr.), C Ben Crites (6-0, 185, Sr.) and RB/LB Austin Hasquet (6-0, 185, Jr.).

Head Coach Jay Weinman has a nice nucleus of 22 varsity players back at VERRADO, where the young Vipers did their best and battled through a tough 1-7 season last fall.

Weinman has some good-sized linemen, namely OT/MLB Logan Guess (6-2, 230, Sr.), FB/DE Rafael Flores (5-10, 200, Sr.), OG/DE Jake Benson (5-10, 190, Jr.), C/DT Craig Pepper (5-9, 300, Sr.) and OG/DT Matt Deluna (5-9, 200, Sr.).

Junior Jake Benson (5-10, 190) and senior Colton Liggera (5-9, 155) are key cogs in the running game.

Coach Jason Stuewe is guiding the **YOUNGKER** Roughriders towards their first varsity campaign. His squad will be dominated by a junior class which produced seven wins in eight games on last season's junior varsity.



Coach Jim Fairfield should put another fine team on the field at **FOUNTAIN HILLS** this season. He had done plenty of that in his 17 years with the Falcons, compiling a very solid 103-70 overall record.

His 2008 squad was one of his best, winning 11 of 13 contests and advancing to the state semifinals. Fairfield returns 18 lettermen, including 13 starters, from that team. And help is on the way from a 7-2 junior varsity.

The skill positions will he manned by the likes of QB Conner Brinton (6-0, 180, Sr.), FB Beau Hilgemann (6-1, 210, Sr.), WR Jordon Henslen (5-11, 175, Sr.), RB Bryce Scannell (5-10, 170, Sr.), RB Rainer Grewstreet (6-1, 180, Jr.) and TE Nathan Shooks (5-11, 190, Jr.). All of those players will see action on the defensive side of the football too.

The Falcons have good size in OL/DT Tyler Bode (6-7, 290, Jr.), OL/DL Alex Forehond (6-3, 215, Sr.) and DT Kelby Sand (6-1, 245, Sr.).

Others to watch include MLB Chase Borron (5-10, 180, Sr.), FS Brandon Vigneux (5-11, 180, Sr.), OL Nick Underwood (6-0, 175, Sr.) and OL/DE Nathan Shooks (5-11, 190, Jr.).

Coach Rich Hoyt has the Wolves of **ESTRELLA FOOTHILLS** playing well. The '08 varsity finished up at 9-3 and 22 lettermen return from that club. The JV was perfect (9-0) a year ago.

Returning performers include QB/DB Wes Budge (6-2, 180, Sr.), TE/LB Troy Coleman (6-1, 180, Sr.), WR/DB Avery Boykin (5-10, 170, Sr.), RB/LB Michael Macko (5-10, 170, Sr.), OL/DL Travis James (6-1, 200, Sr.) and OL/DL John

Laughner (6-2, 230, Jr.). Budge, Coleman and Boykin are strong candidates for individual postseason honors.

The Wolves are also counting on RB/LB Nijhel Simmons (5-11, 190, Sr.), RB/LB Anthony Alfonso (5-9, 160, Jr), OL/DL Michael Bentley (6-2, 270, Jr.) and K/LB Erik Eggert (5-9, 175, Sr.) to help chalk up a whole bunch of wins.

SANTA CRUZ VALLEY, under the guidance of Coach Al Ocampo, split its 10-game schedule last year. There are nine varsity veterans still in uniform, so the Dust Devils have the potential to improve. Obviously, some youngsters are going to have to play key roles too.

The linebacking tandem of Major Harris (6-0, 250, Sr.) and Ricky Cortez (6-0, 225, Jr.) is the backbone of the defense. Senior DE Roger Frost, a 6-0, 175-

pounder, can also be a very disruptive force for opponents.

The Dust Devils will also feature C Andres Aceves (5-11, 175, Jr.), REC Alejandro Arredondo (5-10, 170, Sr.), REC Tim Currier (6-3, 190, Sr.), RB Kadeem Fields (5-10, 180, Sr.), REC Chase House (5-10, 160, Sr.) and WB Azariah Luna (5-9, 175, Sr.).

FLORENCE should bounce back strongly from a subpar 1-9 campaign last year, thanks to the presence of 15 returning starters.

"Last year we played with one senior with varsity experience – LB Chase Simon," says Coach George De La Torre. "That's the reason for so many returnees."

The best of the best are TE/DE Brandon Bourlier (6-5, 240, Sr.), DE Hector Calunga (6-1, 210, Sr.), RB/LB C.J. Williams (5-10, 200, So.), RB/LB Cade Clemons (5-11, 190, Jr.) and WR/DB Kyle Washington (6-1, 190, Jr.).

De La Torre also likes what he sees with DT Julian Dominguez (6-0, 260, Sr.), OL Randy Rees (6-1, 190, Sr.), C Clayton Monks (6-2, 210, Sr.), LB Alex Herrera (5-9, 170, Sr.), OG Gary Ramirez (5-10, 240, Sr.) and QB Jace Hulsey (5-11, 170, Jr.).

Others to watch include OG Sobos Garcia (6-0, 220, Jr), OT Vincent Richey (6-0, 315, Jr.), LB Cody Williams (5-10, 200, Jr.), DT Anthony Montonez (6-1, 210, Sr.), RB/LB/K Jose Perez (5-10, 170, Jr.), RB Andrew White (5-8 150, Jr.), LB Derek Walker (5-10, 170, Jr.), OG Keith Theirel (5-10, 180, Sr.), WR/DB Chuck Smith (5-9, 160, Jr.) and WR Christian Promrej (5-8, 150, Sr.).

The FHS junior varsity and freshman teams compiled records of 7-2 and 10-0 last year, respectively. Some of those players will also contribute in 2009 as the Gophers' varsity reaches for more success.

Coach Arna Bontempts is in his first year at **SOUTH POINTE**, where last fall's varsity unit won four of nine outings. He takes over a squad that returns seven lettermen, headed by WR/QB Shawn Bailey (5-11, 185, Sr.), OT/DT Arturo Borrego (6-5, 275, Jr.), FB/LB Jose Palos (5-10, 220, Sr.) and C/LB Carl Jules (5-9, 205, Sr.).

At the 2A level, **VALLEY CHRISTIAN** has been nearly unbeatable under the direction of Coach Bill Morgan. The Trojans were 9-3 last year, winning the regional championship and advancing to the state semifinals. That's impressive enough.

But VCHS is an eye-opening 42-7 in the four years since Morgan assumed control of the team. Of course, the Trojans won the title in 2005 and finished second in 2006, so excellence has been part of the Valley Christian football programs for some time.

Eight players, led by QB/S/P Jordan Morgan (6-1, 198, Jr.), RB/OLB Blake Argo (5-7, 155, Sr.) and OG/DE Joel Ballew (6-3, 240, Sr.), should set the pace this season.

Morgan is a two-time all-stater. Argo earned all-region honors after scampering for 1,109 yards and 15 touchdowns last year. Ballew was an all defensive lineman in '08.

Additional support comes from RB/CB Addison Bare (5-9, 160, Sr.), FL/FS James Fitzgerald (5-9, 150, Sr.), TE/DE Kyle O'Brien (6-3, 190, Sr.), TE/DE Drew Bond (6-3, 195, Jr.) and C/DT Colton Udall (6-2, 250, Jr.).

How about those Crusaders at NORTHWEST CHRISTIAN? They finished 10-2 last year and Coach Derek Wahlstrom welcomes back 21 lettermen. It's a high-achieving group.

Quarterback Nathan Labarbera (6-2, 190) will have the likes of OT Jordan Hines (6-4, 294, Sr.), C Logan Hines (6-3, 287, Sr.) and OL Travis Lidser (6-3, 250, Jr.) protecting him.

The receivers are wideout Vince Neteel (6-0, 180, Sr.) and TE Ben Mullings (6-3, 210, Sr.), while RB Casey Jahn (6-1, 190, So.) will carry the pigskin a lot. Kicker Nate Bowman (5-10, 160, Sr.) could also assist with the win-total again this year.

Eight offensive and eight defensive regulars are back in uniform for Coach Jeff Fox at **SCOTTSDALE CHRISTIAN**. Altogether, 23 letterwinners return from last year's 8-3 bunch.

The '09 Eagles will be led by C/DL Francis Eusebio (6-2, 225, Sr.), OL/DL Luke Siwek (6-0, 265, Jr.), OL/DL Scott Aufderheide (6-3, 235, Sr.) and OL/DL Jordan Tyler (6-3, 240, Jr.) in the battles up front
