3A Girls & Boys Playoff Preview

3A GIRLS PREVIEW

Sabino head coach Jaamal Rhodes said his team has fought through a number of injuries, including concussions and losing starting point guard Kam Rhodes to an ACL injury early in December. After losing four straight in the Nike Tournament of Champions, Sabino came back and beat No. 1 4A Sahuaro with a limited roster.

Sabino's key players include Kamryn Doty, Kiya Dorroh and Kadie Healy.

Coach Rhodes said Doty is heart and engine of the team, plays extremely hard, and is a vocal leader with experience.

He said Dorroh is a talented wing player that plays multiple positions and is another experienced leader.

Rhodes said Healy is a quiet leader that just gives everything she has.

Page head coach Ryan Whitehorse said he is proud of this year's inexperienced team and how the Lady Sand Devils have battled back from losing three tight games in a row. Whitehorse said the Lady Sand Devils realized they needed a change, and the team responded defensively as a team. He said the team has worked hard since the three losses.

"This is my fourth year as head coach for the program, but girls basketball at Page High School have a big history far into state and bringing home state titles," Whitehorse said. "We've won the last two titles, but coaches before me have started the tradition and won a total of six titles."

Whitehorse continued, "The group of girls I have this year have been a part of a very successful program winning the last two titles, but haven't got the experience of what it truly takes to win it all until this year. They've really stepped up and accepted their roles on the team. Each day they work hard and make each other better. My coaching staff does a great job of motivating them every practice and keeping them accountable on their work ethics. We've come together as one at the right moment in the season and will definitely help going into playoffs."

Diana Secody, a junior post, is one of three top

players with experience. Whitehorse said Secody is the hardest worker on the team. She motivates and pushes her teammates each day in practice. Senior forward Camryn Nockideneh is another top player. Whitehorse said just Nockideneh's presence being in games benefits the team. She is a four-year varsity player with tons of experience. Senior point guard Ashlyn Adakai is the most positive leader of the team. She has the biggest heart on the team and pushes everyone to be their best, the coach said.

Chinle coach Francine McCurtain is in her third year. In her first year, the team made it to the state tournament quarterfinals. Last year, it went to the semifinals. "Who knows how far we will go this year," she said. "I am looking forward to our girls working together and doing their best."

"We are a very young team with only three seniors and having a winning season is awesome. We look forward to our state games and hope to make it far into the bracket."

McCurtain said senior center Tea Murray is a great communicator, exemplifies leadership through her knowledge of the game and is a great shooter for a person of her height. She also sees the floor well for assists and never gives up.

McCurtain said senior point guard Brandii Clah has taken in the skills to handle the ball very well. At the top of her game is defense. She loves to force turnovers and puts 100 percent effort in improving her team's efforts.

McCurtain said senior guard Meishyla Begay is one of the team's best shooters. She never shows emotion of frustration or defeat. "She does a great job helping our guards handle the ball and communicates quietly as much as she can," coach said.

McCurtain said sophomore power forward Aisha Ashley gets rebounds and isn't afraid to be physical. She leads the team in scoring right now.

McCurtain said, "I believe I am most proud that our seniors have really stepped up and become very unselfish towards each other on and off the court."

Tuba City head coach Kimberley Williams believes the Lady Warriors play in the toughest region in Division III. The Lady Warriors are seeded third overall. Tuba City split with both Page, Ganado

and Chinle. It finished second at the Lake Powell tournament and third in the Pepsi tournament in Flagstaff this season.

Tuba City was the state runner-up in 2015 and has earned a berth in the Elite Eight each year at state. In the history of the school, Tuba City has won three back-to-back state titles in girls' basketball.

Williams said senior point guard Larissa Yazzie is a team leader and controls the tempo and creates for the team offensively and defensively.

Williams said senior forward Jayda Chee is a leader on the boards and her defense is tenacious.

Williams also said junior guard MiKeya Sheppard is the team's defensive specialist. She is quick to the basket and defends the other teams' best guards under normal points.

Window Rock senior Jana Solee is a team leader. Window Rock head coach Sharon Toadecheenie said Solee has people skills and loves to communicate with players on and off the playing field.

Senior Bayle Talkalai, said coach Toadecheenie, is building relationship with students and athletes in general, and senior forward Rachael Smiley takes responsibility and initiative for oneself and others.

"We are proud we represent Navajo Nation, Window Rock High School, the community, parents/guardians and the players themselves," coach said. "We have been improving each year with more skill players coming through the program. We have come close to advancing every year in the tournament. In 2018, we advanced to the Final Four, losing to Page."

Tanque Verde coach Michael Edwards said his team's three captains, seniors Emma Morris, Kailee Cullinan and Carly Huber, have been on varsity since their freshmen season. He said the three seniors are the program's all-time record holders for total career wins. They have helped the program to four straight 20-win seasons.

He said this season's team only has eight total players. The program is in its 14th season and made the state playoffs for the first time in 2015-16 and has made it five seasons in a row.

Florence coach Bob Bellemare said the team's twin guards, Alex and Aliya Brown, are forces for the team. Both are very good ball handling point guards with great ability to drive and pass the ball. Sielle Neal and Bryn O'Rourke are the team's shooting

guards. Bryn is leading the team, averaging 17 points a game. Michelle Giddens is a very good shooting forward and very tough under the boards. The five have been together for years now. "We run a fast pace, up tempo, high pressure basketball game," coach said.

Bryn will be attending Ottawa University to play basketball next year. She leads the team in shooting and has shot over 160 three point shots, making 40 per cent of her shots.

Bellemore said since the girls were freshmen, the team has been in the state playoffs every year. They made it to the second round last year, losing to Page. This group of seniors has been a great representatives for Florence High School.

Page head coach Justin Smith said the team's leaders are senior guards Gabe Gomez and Jordan Varner. Smith said Gomez and Varner lead by example and positive attitude.

Smith said the team's accomplishments include, "The shift in culture and team chemistry. The boys put in the work and truly put the team ahead of themselves."

Smith said he believes the program has been beaten in the second round of the state tournament the last two years.

Leading **Snowflake**, according to coach Andy Wood, are senior point guard Devin Willis and senior forward Troy Brinkerhoff.

Wood said, "After many years of making the state tournament, we didn't make it last year and the team worked hard and bounced back to get a top eight seed this year."

In 2011, the team advanced to Elite Eight, 2012 Final Four, 2013 Final Four, 2014 second round, 2015 State Champion, and 2016 Final Four.

Paradise Honors head coach Zach Hettel said senior wing Jerry Iliya is a returning team captain who brings a lot of energy to the floor and constant communication. He is the team's quarterback on defense.

Jalen Scott, a junior point guard, is a team captain. "He can do just about everything on the floor," coach said. "Very unselfish player who takes pride in getting his teammates going."

Nate Pickens is the team's leading scorer at 17 points, and Wyatt Bell is averaging 15. Iliya is aver-

aging 13 point and nine rebounds. Scott is averaging 11 points and seven assists per game and had more than 450 assists in his high school career.

"Grit and determination, we played a very tough schedule in the front half of the season," Hettel said. "Played half of those games after losing Jerry Iliaya to a foot injury. When fully healthy, we went 3-1 in the Visit Mesa tournament, including wins over Chaparral, Brophy and Mercer Island, WA."

At the state tournament, Paradise Honors has lost in the semifinals in back-to-back years, two years ago in 2A and last year in 3A semis. Its first ever state playoffs appearance was in 2016-17 season.

Valley Christian team leaders include the following players:

Logan Phillips is the scoring leader and probably one of the best offensive players in 3A, coach said.

Jackson Risi is a vital scorer and ball handler.

Shane Haagama is a "glue guy," a great defender, leader in assists and steals.

Chandler Carter is a post defender and rebounder.

Jacob Rice is a tremendous athlete, scorer, rebounder and defender.

Coach Gary Haagsma said, "We lost nine seniors and most all the minutes and scoring of our 2019 state championship team.

"We have carved our own niche and they are getting after it. Wins over Boulder Creek, a good 6A team, Scottsdale Christian, defending state champs at 2A, American Leadership-Queen Creek, a very good 3A team and possible title contender."

Haagama said Valley Christian has won six state titles, including last year, two runner-up and a couple Final Four appearances.

According to **Chinle** head coach Raul Mendoza, leaders for Chinle Wildcats are Cooper Burbank,
