ATHLETIC CODE OF ETHICS FOR INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES

Forward

The competitive interscholastic activities and sports program of secondary schools provides an opportunity to evaluate competing high schools as to what has been taught to the active contestants and the spectators.

The Purpose of Interscholastic Competition

The fundamental principle for competitive activities and sports is to serve the education of youth. It should both promote and supplement the regular curricular program.

Standards for Contestants

School representatives in interscholastic contests should have satisfactory academic records, have demonstrated good conduct and citizenship in their previous school relationships, and have satisfactorily met all the eligibility requirements of the 5A Conference and the A.I.A.

Coaches and sponsors should instruct and develop among student representatives of competing and contesting schools:

- The competitive urge to excel.
- The love of and respect for the activity and sport.
- The acceptance of officials' decisions without grumbling, defiance or disobedience.
- A high sense of honor, duty and ethical character.
- A cooperative spirit and a spirit of good will toward opponents and people in general.
- The realization that participation in an activity or sport is its own reward and special privileges for participants are not to be expected or condoned.

Standards for Coaches, Sponsors and Those Administering Activity Programs

The individual student's welfare is most important aspect and has precedence over any other consideration.

A well-developed sense of personal honor, integrity and courage are the most important traits of those in charge of a program of activities and sports.

Sponsors of activities should have developed a strong sense of ethical relationships toward the school they represent and toward their opponent, and should be willing to accept the personal responsibility for their actions and for the reputation of the group and school they represent.

The rules of the activity and sport should be followed to the letter. The circumvention of the rules or the spirit of the rules is a gross violation of the confidences placed upon those in charge of the activities.

Coaches and sponsors in charge of activities and sports should permit individual players' greater opportunities to make decisions that determine and affect the outcome of the game and/or activity. This is the only way a democracy may create an active and responsible leadership.

Filming Athletic Contests

There shall be **no** filming of other teams for scouting purposes.

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I – NAME

Section 1. Name

The name of this organization shall be **5A CONFERENCE of the Arizona Interscholastic Association, Inc.**, hereinafter referred to as the A.I.A.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

Section 1. Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to regulate all 5A Conference activities within the framework of the rules and procedures set forth by the Constitution and Bylaws of the A.I.A.

Section 2. Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of this organization, all assets remaining at such time after payment of all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to the member schools on a current membership basis. To qualify for the above, a school must have been a member of this conference for three years.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership

Any high school may become a member upon:

- a. Meeting the requirements for A.I.A. memberships;
- b. Being assigned to the Conference by the A.I.A. Executive Board.

Section 2. Method of Application

A formal application shall be submitted by the high school principal to the A.I.A. Executive Board by November 1 of the year proceeding the actual school year of active membership.

Section 3. Region Membership

The 5A is divided into Regions. The 5A Conference Executive Board shall assign each new member school to a Region.

Section 4. Region Membership

A Region may assign a school, sport by sport, to another 5A Region with the approval of the Conference Executive Committee.

Section 5. Region Membership

A Region may organize leagues at its discretion.

Section 6. Scheduling

A new school may be permitted to schedule athletic contests for the school year following approval.

ARTICLE IV – MEETINGS

Section 1. Meetings

Meeting may be called by the President at any time he/she deems it necessary. When so directed by a majority of the Executive Board members, a special meeting may be called. The President shall preside at all meetings, which will be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. Official Representation

- a. Each school shall be represented by the Principal, or a person designated by the Principal from the school district, and shall have one vote. This does not have to be a written designation.
- b. Proxy Vote – Any member school may be represented by their respective Region Chairperson with a written, dated proxy vote.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

Section 1. 5A Executive Board

- a. Membership: The Executive Board shall consist of a President, President-elect, 2 representatives from each Region of the 5A Conference (including Region Chairs), and the 5A Representative on the A.I.A. Executive Board.

The Representatives on the 5A Executive Board shall be as follows:

- b. Election: The members of the Conference Executive Board shall be elected by May 1 as follows:

- 1. Region Chairs: Selected by majority votes of the Region membership. They shall serve a two (2) year term on both the 5A Executive Board. (Terms to match 2-year scheduling block.)
- 2. Region Representatives: Selected by majority votes of the Region membership, 2-year term.
- 3. President: President-elect from previous year, 1-year term.
- 4. President-elect: Shall be selected on the following rotational basis commencing 2007-2008:

5. A.I.A. Executive Board Representative: The 5A Conference representative on the A.I.A. Executive Board shall serve a 3 year term and shall be rotated among the 12 Regions.

Section 2. Legislative Council

The Legislative Council shall consist of the following 9 members:

Odd Number Years:	Division I	5 Members

- * No Region can be eliminated from voting for two consecutive years
- * No Region can serve twice until all Regions have had the opportunity to serve once.

Section 3. Duties

The Executive Board shall have general control over the 5A Conference athletic contests. Within the policies set forth by the A.I.A., the 5A Executive Board shall:

- Interpret the Constitution, Bylaws and Sports Rules of any Region of the Conference when requested.
- Administer the distribution, expenditures, and accounting of all Conference revenue.
- Arrange all Regions, Conference play-offs, championship contests and State semi-final contests to A.I.A. regulations and approval.
- Appoint special committees when necessary.
- By a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board, adopt or change Bylaws and Sports Rules and Regulations

Section 4. Meetings

The Executive Board will meet regularly during the school year.

Section 5. Voting

- Each Region Chairperson, Region Representative, the President, the President Elect and the 5A Representative to the AIA Executive Board will have one vote. The total of 27 votes.
- Proxy Voting will be permitted when a Board Member is unable to attend an Executive Board meeting with a written statement from the Board Member.

ARTICLE VI – DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. President

The President shall call all meetings of the Conference membership and Executive Board and shall preside at these meetings. He/She is an ex-officio member of all committees.

Section 2. President-elect

The President-elect shall, in the absence of the President, preside at Executive Board and regular meetings.

Section 3. Continuing Secretary

- a. Keep the minutes of all meetings and distribute copies to all member schools.
- b. Have charge of all records and property of the Conference.
- c. Receive, disburse and account for all funds of the Conference including an annual audit.
- d. Perform such other duties as prescribed by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VII – QUORUM

Section 1. Quorum

A two-thirds majority of the voting membership shall constitute a quorum at any Region, Conference, or Executive Board meeting.

ARTICLE VII – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Methods of Proposing Amendments

Amendments to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Sports Rules and Regulations may be proposed by:

- a. A member school to its Region; and if approved by a majority vote of the Region, it shall be submitted to the Conference membership at a regular or special meeting.
- b. The Executive Board to the Conference membership.

Section 2. Adoption

- a. Amendments to the Constitution shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the membership.
- b. Amendments to the Bylaws and Sports Rules and Regulations shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the Executive Board.

Section 3. Notice

Notice of proposed amendments to the Constitution must be published and submitted to the membership at least fourteen days before final action may be taken.

Section 4. Effective Date

Conference Rules - A Conference may, by a two-thirds vote, empower its Executive Board to establish rules to govern contests and starting dates for specific sports. Such rules may be more restrictive than those contained in the A.I.A. Bylaws, but not less restrictive.

1. A rule that is more restrictive than the pertinent A.I.A. rule may go into effect after passage, exclusive of June, July, and August.
2. A Conference rule, enacted by its Executive Board that is more restrictive than the pertinent A.I.A. rule, shall be referred to the Conference as a whole for vote at the request of an individual school or Region. A three-fourths vote of the Conference is necessary to sustain the ruling.

Region Rules—Any Region, with Conference approval, may set rules to govern contests. Region rules may be more restrictive than the pertinent A.I.A. rules, but not less restrictive.

ARTICLE IX – RE-ALIGNMENT

Section 1. Methods of Proposing Re-Alignment

- a. A member region; and if approved by a majority vote of the region, may submit a re-alignment proposal to the Conference Executive Board at a regular or special meeting.
- b. The conference may form a re-alignment committee made up of the region chairpersons to submit proposals to the Conference Executive Board at a regular or special meeting.

Section 2. Adoption

- a. A re-alignment proposal shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board
- b. Amendments to the re-alignment proposals shall be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Board.

5A State Qualifying by Sport

Badminton **Team Tournament**-Two teams from each automatically qualify for the state tournament through regular season standings. The next 8 highest ranked teams according to power ratings also qualify. Seeding is based on power ratings.
Individual Tournament-Top four individuals and doubles team from each region.

Cross Cntry All teams qualify for the state meet. Region tournaments are run for Region purposes only.

Boys Golf **28 Division I Teams/29 Division II Teams**
All 5A schools will be blind drawn into two (2) Divisions I and two (2) Division II Super Regional Tournaments. The top eight teams and 6 individuals (not on advancing teams) in each Super Regional advance from the Super Regional to their respective State Tournament (92 golfers).

Girls Golf The **six (6)** Division I Regions and **six (6)** Division II Regions will host their own Region Tournaments.
Each Region will qualify for the State Tournament using the state Qualifying formula based on the number of teams assigned to the Region by the 5A Conference.

Swimming Division I and Division II State Meets. Region Champion , Outside Qualifiers plus the next fastest times on the second day of the Regional Meet to fill out 24 entries per event qualify for the state meet.

Tennis **Team: See below**
Individual: Each 5A Division I and Division II school may enter two individuals and two doubles teams in their division's State Individual Tournament.

Track Region champion and next 24-27 individuals.

Wrestling **Team: Top 16 teams qualify based on power ratings. Region Champions** automatically qualify but are seeded by power ratings. Region Champions shall be determined by regular season team standings or a region team tournament. If a Region Tournament is held, the Region Champion shall be the Automatic Qualifier. Regions must declare their method of determining the Region Champion by the beginning of the school year.
Individual: All wrestlers qualify for the state meet. Region tournaments may be held to determine individual region champions. The top eight (8) wrestlers will be seeded according to criteria approved by the 5A Executive Board.

Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Tennis, Soccer, Softball, Baseball

Sixteen (16) teams qualify for DI and DII State Tournaments. Region Champions automatically qualify; all others are determined by Power Points or Power Ratings. Region Champions shall be determined by Regular Season Standings or Region Tournaments. If a Region Tournament is held the Region Tournament Champions **shall** be the Automatic Qualifier. Regions must declare their method of determining the Region Champion by the beginning of the school year. 1/2007

AIA Power Point System Guidelines

The following Power Point System will be used for all sports except 5A Football.

CONTEST GUIDELINES

1. In order to qualify for the State tournament, a team must play within a region and compete against a minimum number of AIA member schools as determined by conference and sport. A chart for each sport follows:

Sport	Max allowed (based on AIA Bylaws)	Minimum Required
Badminton	14	12
Baseball	18	16
Basketball	18	16
Football	10	8
Soccer	4A – 9; All others – 12	4A – 8; All others – 10
Softball	18	16
Tennis – Team	14	12
Volleyball	17	15
Wrestling - Team	8	6

2. Contests with non-AIA member schools will not be counted in the calculation of Victory or Bonus points for the AIA member competing school and will not count as a qualifying game. The member school's opponents will earn Bonus points based upon the outcome of the game results.
3. A non-AIA member school may be accepted as a qualifying opponent to meet the minimum game requirements. These opponents must be approved by the Conference Executive Committee and will be aligned as an AIA member based upon their current enrollment. The AIA member school is required to provide the necessary information on enrollment, and wins for these approved schools.
4. When a team has scheduled more than the maximum number of allowable games, the team must identify the non-counting games before the season of competition. The number of counting games cannot exceed the normal number of allowable games, and all region games must be counted.
5. All games must use the conference/sport determined method for resolving ties and completing games. If a game cannot be resolved, each team will receive one-half of the Victory point value, and bonus points will distributed as half of the point total to their opponents.
6. Forfeited games will result in Victory and Bonus points being awarded based upon the result of the forfeit.

7. Cancelled games will result in no Victory points being awarded, and the game removed from each teams qualifying games. Bonus points will be rewarded as half of the value to each team.
8. Changes to reported results will not be accepted after a designated time that is set by the AIA tournament committee. If changes are made to the qualifying teams after the final results have been submitted, no teams will be substituted and the first round game will result in a bye.
9. Each Conference Executive Board will create a Playoff committee of 3 members. This committee will investigate and make recommendations to the Conference Board regarding rule interpretations and actions in unforeseen circumstances. This committee will also review schedules before each season to insure compliance with preseason rules.

VICTORY POINTS

- Victory points are awarded for each game that a team wins.
- Victory Points are awarded based upon the conference classification of each school in the following matrix.

- The Power Point Index is calculated by the following formula
- $$\frac{\text{Sum(Victory Points)} + \text{Sum(Bonus Points)}}{\text{Counting Games}} = \text{Power Index}$$

SCHEDULE CONSIDERATIONS

- Each team should be scheduled with the same number of games. Usually the Conference Allowable Maximum.
- Allow rural areas to schedule non-member schools and schools from other conferences to cut down on travel, preserve class time, and create local rivalries.
- Equalize the number of games with cross-conference or division games.
- Equalize the number of regions represented on each team's schedule.
- Equalize the total number of games played between individual regions in total.
- Equalize the number of games within region play to create a consistent relationship between guaranteed points for region teams.

Criteria for Selection of Honorees

R.E. McCullar Award:

1. The McCullar Award will be provided for 5A membership schools.
2. Award points will be recognized for sports that have been approved by the A.I.A.
3. In case of a tie in any category, duplicate points will be awarded.
4. **Fall and Winter results from current year and Spring results from previous year are used.**

NOTE: 50% of the 5A Conference schools must offer a given sport before the sport will be considered for the McCullar Award.

BADMINTON

SCHEDULE

The Region master schedule may include cross-region and non-conference competition.

GAME LIMITS

A school may schedule a maximum of sixteen (16) varsity games, including one (1) invitational.

A school may schedule fourteen (14) junior.

ENTRIES IN REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

- A. The Region tournament will be single elimination.
- B. The State Individual tournament will be double elimination.

5A SPECIAL RULES

A. Regional Tournament Organization

1. Seeding and Draw Procedures—The seeding for 1-8 will be as follows:
 - #1 will go at the top of the draw
 - #2 at the bottom
 - #3 in the same half as #2 is placed where they do not meet until quarterfinals
 - #4 in the same half as #1 and placed where they do not meet until quarterfinals
 - #5 placed opposite #4 where they do not meet until the round before quarterfinals
 - #6 placed opposite #3 where they do not meet until the round before quarterfinals
 - #7 placed opposite #2 where they do not meet until the round before quarterfinals
 - #8 placed opposite #1 where they do not meet until the round before quarterfinalsRemaining positions are drawn at random from a group of paper slips, each bearing the name of the school and player's name. Each school's two entries will be separated into the upper and lower brackets during the random draw.
2. Substitution
May take place in Regional play up to the player's first match, provided the substitute player has not currently been placed in another position in the Regional Tournament
3. Officials
An official will be present throughout the entire Regional Tournament and act as a roving official as needed. The semi-final and final matches shall have Officials to call the matches and shall be paid accordingly.
4. Scheduling
 - a. Rest period between matches shall be 15 minutes. Split matches five minutes.
 - b. Scheduling of single and double matches shall be concurrently.
5. State Tournament Substitutions
 - a. Should a Regional qualified singles entry be unable to participate in the State Tournament, the next best player from that school will be inserted into the tournament in place of that player.
 - b. Should a Regional qualified doubles player not be able to participate, the coach may substitute another player who has not qualified currently in a Regional.

BADMINTON 5A REGIONAL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Regional Team Champion and Runner-up will be determined by the season record. You play everyone once in your Region.

CRITERIA FOR REGIONAL TEAM CHAMPIONS AND RUNNER-UP

1. Region win/loss record.
2. Head to head results if two teams are tied.
3. Power Ratings.
4. If three teams are tied, look only at their head to head matches and add the wins of the dual singles and doubles of all three teams.
5. If two teams are still tied on wins, then go back to head to head contest.

5A STATE QUALIFYING FORMULA

Team Tournament-Two teams from each Region automatically qualify for the state tournament through regular season standings. The next 8 highest ranked teams according to power ratings also qualify. Seeding is based on power ratings.

Individual Tournament-Top 4 singles and doubles teams from the Region Tournament shall advance to the state tournament.

BASEBALL

SCHEDULES

Each Region will develop a region schedule from within the region. The Region chairpersons from each region will then finalize all schedules to ensure that each 5A Conference school schedule needs is met.

GAME LIMITS

- A. A school may schedule a maximum of twenty (20) varsity games, including two (2) invitationals which shall count as one game each. A school may schedule a maximum of nineteen (19) junior varsity and nineteen (19) freshman games.
- B. Regional qualifying tournaments and state tournament games are not included in the game limit.
- C. Varsity allowed one scrimmage.

STATE BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

- A. The State Baseball Tournament will be a double elimination Tournament.
- B. The top seeded team shall be the home team throughout the State Tournament including the first round game. (9/2006)

5A STATE QUALIFYING FORMULA

Sixteen (16) teams qualify for DI and DII State Tournament. Region Champions automatically qualify, all others are determined by power points or power ratings. Region Champions shall be determined by regular season standings or region tournament. If a Region Tournament is held the Region Tournament Champion shall be the Automatic Qualifier. Regions must declare their method of determining the Region Champion by the beginning of the school year.

BASKETBALL

SCHEDULES

Each Region will develop a region schedule from within the region. The Region Chairpersons will then finalize all schedules to ensure that each 5A Conference School.

GAMES LIMITS

- A. A school may schedule a maximum of twenty (20) varsity games, including two (2) invitationals which shall count as one game each. A school may schedule nineteen (19) junior varsity and eighteen (18) freshman games.
- B. Regional qualifying tournaments and state tournament games are not included in game limits.
- C. Varsity allowed one scrimmage.

5A CONFERENCE BASKETBALL PLAY-OFF SYSTEM

- 1. First and Second Round games shall be played at the site of the highest seed. (9/2006)
- 2. Third Round (Semi-final and Final) games will be played at a site determined by the A.I.A. Home team is determined by highest seed.
- 3. A.I.A. will have final authority on selection of state tournament sites.

POWER RATINGS

- 1. All games will count including invitational and region tournament games.
- 2. Power Ratings are available on-line at www.mesasports.org throughout the season.
- 3. Region Representatives are responsible for verifying records for their region at a state tournament seeding meeting to take place on Sunday at 8:00 A.M. following the region tournaments at a site **To Be Determined**.

5A STATE QUALIFYING FORMULA

Sixteen (16) teams qualify for DI and DII State Tournament. Region champions automatically qualify, all others are determined by power points or power ratings. Region Champions shall be determined by regular season standings or region tournament. If a Region Tournament is held the Region Tournament Champion shall be the Automatic Qualifier. Regions must declare their method of determining the Region Champion by the beginning of the school year.

CROSS COUNTRY

SCHEDULES

Each Region will develop a region schedule from within the region. The Region Chairperson from each region will then finalize all schedules to ensure that each 5A Conference schools scheduling need is met.

GAME LIMITS

- A. A school may schedule a maximum of twelve (12) meets including unlimited invitationals.
- B. Region and state tournament meets are not included in the game limit.
- C. A team will consist of at least five, but no more than seven runners in uniform.
- D. No meets will be run in the afternoon in September. Meets may be run in the morning and on weekends. (**Exception:** Regions may request from the 5A Executive Board an exemption for scheduling purposes.) 1/2006

5A STATE QUALIFYING FORMULA

All teams qualify for the state meet. Region tournaments are run for Region purposes only.

FOOTBALL

GAME LIMITS

- A. A school may schedule a maximum of ten (10) varsity games. A school may schedule nine (9) junior varsity and nine (9) freshman games.
- B. Varsity allowed one scrimmage.

5A CONFERENCE FOOTBALL PLAY-OFF SYSTEM

- 1. Sixteen teams will qualify for the 5A Division 1 and 2 State Tournament.
- 2. Teams will be selected based upon the following criteria:
 - A. Region champions will automatically qualify.
 - B. The next highest Power Indexes will complete the field.
- 3. Seeding for the Tournament will be as follows:

All sixteen (16) teams will be seeded based upon Power Index Points.
- 4. The home team for the first round of the State Playoffs shall be the team with the highest power point total. In case of a tie, the team with the best overall record shall be the host team. (Approved 1/2006)
- 5. The National Federation 10-yard overtime procedure will be used to resolve a tie game.

POINT CALCULATION

- 1. Fifty (50) victory points will be awarded for each 5A win.

Five (5) bonus points will be awarded for each win of all your 5A opponents, Regardless of classification.

Use the following formula to calculate 5A Power Index:

$$\frac{\text{Sum (5A Victory points)} + \text{Sum (5A Bonus Points)}}{\text{Total number of 5A games played}} = \text{Power Index}$$

Total number of 5A games played

OTHER INFORMATION

1. Teams must play a minimum of eight (8) 5A games or their equivalent.
2. In the event of special circumstances, a school may petition the 5A Executive Board to declare a 5A equivalent in order to be eligible for the playoff. (In order to meet 8 football game requirement).
3. Out of state schools will be assigned classification based upon Arizona criteria for enrollment.
4. Varsity games only will be eligible to receive victory points. Bonus points will include all games played, with a maximum of ten (10) games. **All Region games must be counted.** In the event of eleven (11) games, the school must declare the non-counted game prior to the season of competition.
5. Forfeit games will result in victory and bonus points for all teams being awarded based on the result of the forfeit. Changes will be made after 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday following the last regular season game.
6. Changes in the qualifying teams will not be made after noon on Monday following the last regular season game. In the event of a change, the next highest point total team, #17, will be inserted in the vacated spot. The highest seeded team will be granted a home game.

DETERMINATION OF REGION CHAMPION

The following criteria will be used to determine Region Champion:

1. Region record
2. Head-to-Head competition, record among tied teams
3. Power Index
4. Bonus Points
5. Coin Flip

Once a team has been clearly selected based upon one criterion, it is not necessary to continue.

NOTE: All records must be submitted by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday following the last A.I.A. scheduled game.

TIE-BREAKER FOR SEEDING PURPOSES

The following criteria will be used to determine at large qualifiers:

1. Head-to-Head competition
2. Overall Record
3. Region Champion
4. Record vs. Your Region Champion 12/14/2006
5. Bonus Points
6. Team whose Region qualifiers have the highest total power points.
7. Football Advisory Committee decision.

PLAYOFF LOCATIONS

The following criteria will be used to determine playoff sites:

1. Round One – Home Team-Top Seeded Team or if tied the team with best over all record
2. Round Two – Home Team-Top Seeded Team
3. Round Three (Semi-Finals)-Neutral site selected by Region Chair of highest seeded team.
4. Round Four (Championship)-Selected by A.I.A.
5. The A.I.A. will have the final authority on selection of state tournament sites.

5A STATE QUALIFYING FORMULA

Sixteen (16) teams qualify for DI and DII State Tournaments. Region Champions automatically qualify, all others are determined by power points or power ratings. Region Champions shall be determined by regular season standings.

Golf

GAME LIMITS

A school may schedule a maximum of fourteen (14) varsity matches including up to five (5) invitationals. One of the invitationals may be a two day 36 hole tournament if Saturday is one of the days.

RULES

- A. All competitions will be conducted as prescribed in A.I.A. Bylaws.
** 2007 Season Rule Change:
AIA 24.9.2.8.3 Exception: 5A Conference – Coaching will be permitted as per USGA Rules of Golf, Rule 8. Each 5A team may have one designated coach per match/tournament. Coaches may not be on the greens or in the bunkers.
- B. All team members shall wear proper attire. Proper attire is defined as the current dress code found in the current handbook of the Junior Golf Association of Arizona (JGAA.org)

All team members shall wear proper attire that includes:

- Belts on boys, on girls only if belt loops are present
- Hats worn properly (bills forward)
- Sleeves and collars on boys' shirts (Mock golf shirts are acceptable)
- Collared shirts on girls (Sleeveless and Mock golf shirts are acceptable)
- Capri pants and skorts on girls that are appropriate and acceptable for golf
- Shorts must be No shorter than a dollar bill length from the top of the knee
- Boys' shorts must NOT be lower than the bottom of the knee.
- Girls shirts not to rise above the belt line at any time during the golf swing
- Shorts or pants cannot have more than four (4) pockets
- Spikeless golf shoes or tennis shoes only (Shoes must be worn at all times)

All clothing must be worn in a neat and respectable way.

Improper attire includes, but is not limited to:

- C. Coaches' responsibilities and duties for each competition will be determined by the Games Committee for that event.
- D. Spectators will be allowed during the competition if approved by the golf course management and the games committee. At Regional, Super Regional and State Tournaments, the Games Committee will monitor spectator's conduct. During interschool competitions, the coaches will monitor spectators.
- E. A match will consist of 5 scores for Boys and 4 scores for girls.

RULES FOR REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

- A. The State Qualifying Tournament will be conducted under the same rules as the State Tournament using A.I.A. Bylaws. (Tie-breaking procedures shall be the same.) (In reference to A.I.A. policy 24.9.4 Practice on Site. Practice will be defined as (playing the course, walking the course and or the use of the practice facilities including the range, chipping and the putting green.) A player or team that violates Rule 24.9.4 will be subject to disqualification.)
- B. The Tournament Director (the administrator in charge of the event) shall be the Chairperson of the Games Committee.
- C. The golf representative from each Region will be on the Games Committee for his/her Region.
- D. The Tournament Games Committee shall:
 - 1. Determine the site for the tournament.
 - 2. Make pairings and determine procedures for keeping score.
 - 3. Assign duties for coaches during the tournament.
 - 4. Determine the responsibility for on course rules decisions.
 - 5. Determine any adjustments (local rules), which are necessary to conduct the tournament fairly and prepare an information sheet explaining these changes as well as each players' responsibilities during the tournament.
 - 6. When a school does not enter a team or is unable to return four eighteen hole scores each day, it may enter or continue play with a minimum of one or a maximum of three individuals to compete for the low medalist. It is the responsibility of the team and the coach to have an eligible player report for each of their teams assigned starting times. When an assigned starting time is not used, it is forfeited.
 - 7. Each school may enter one team consisting of a minimum of four or a maximum of five players. When a school does not enter a team, it may enter a minimum of one or a maximum of three individuals to compete for the low medalist.
 - 8. There is no stipulation that the same players participate each day. Only those players who complete 36 holes of competition are eligible for individual awards.
 - 9. The Boys and Girls teams will qualify for the state tournament according to the following formulas stated.

SUPER REGIONAL QUALIFYING TO STATE

Teams will be separated into Division 1 and Division 2.

Each division will follow the following Formula.

1. All regions will be blind drawn into 2 Super Regional Tournaments. The sports advisory chair and an administrative witness (A.I.A.) will draw the teams.
2. The blind draw will take place at the earliest possible time. There will be a different draw for each year of the current two-year block. The draws will be held consecutively.
3. The Super Regional sites will be determined after the draw according to logistics of the teams that are selected in each Super Regional to minimize travel expenses. The A.I.A. will determine the sites.
4. Each Super Regional will qualify the top 8 teams and 6 individuals not on those teams for the state tournament. Tournament size: 16 Teams and 12 Individuals for a total of 92 players per Division.

GAME LIMITS

- A. A school may schedule a maximum of fourteen (14) varsity games which includes two (2) invitational tournaments. A school may schedule twelve (12) junior varsity and twelve (12) freshman games.
- B. Regional qualifying tournaments and state tournament games are not included in the game limit.
- C. The Varsity is allowed one scrimmage.

STATE TOURNAMENT

The highest seeded team shall be the home team throughout the State Tournament including the first round game. (9/2006)

GAME TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES

All regular season and state playoff games that are tied after the two forty (40) minute halves and two (2) ten minute overtime periods shall be decided utilizing penalty kicks as outline in Article 25 of the A.I.A. Handbook.

The State Championship game, if tied after the two forty (40) minute halves and two ten (10) minute periods shall be decided by playing no more than two five (5) minute sudden victory overtime periods. If a tie still exists, penalty kicks will be utilized as per Article 25 of the A.I.A. Handbook to determine the winner.

Region Champions shall be determined by the regular season standings or region tournament. If a Region Tournament is held, the Region Tournament Champion shall be the Automatic Qualifier. SOFTBALL

SCHEDULES

Each Region will develop a Region schedule from within the Region.
The Region Chairpersons from each Region will then finalize all schedules to ensure that each 5A Conference school schedule needs are met.

GAME LIMITS

Relays qualify as a school and not as individuals.

Diving: In 5A Division I and Division II, the top **seven** (7) Place winners in one meter diving from the Region Meets shall advance to the State Diving Meet. 12/14/06

OUTSIDE QUALIFIERS

State qualifying times in 5A Division I and Division II shall be based on the twelfth (12th) place time in the 5A State Finals based on the average of the five (5) most recent years of State Final Results. Qualifying times shall be made only in 5A approved Invitational Meets, City, District and Regional Meets that satisfy all criteria for a 5A State Qualifying Meet. The Athlete will only be eligible to participate in the events that were swum at the Regional Meet regardless of events qualified for through other approved Qualifying Meets.

Automatic State Qualifying Times shall be submitted to the 5A Executive Board for approval prior to the season.

1. AIA Sanctioned Meets that have been approved by the 5A Swim and Dive Committee. The meets include the Region Qualifying Meets and other sanctioned meets held during the season of competition.
2. Four or more schools participating in the meet.
3. Three (3) certified officials, Meet Referee, Starter, Stroke and Turn Judge.
4. Electronic timing system.
5. All criteria must be met for any State Outside Qualifying Standard to be achieved.
6. The Meet Director must forward the preliminary and final results to the State Meet Director.

There shall be a “**5A Coach of the Year**” award, to be voted on by the coaches at the 5A State meet.
