RULES

Official rules shall be those of the current National Federation Football Rule Book, the AIA Constitution and Bylaws, and these tournament instructions.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Prior to each varsity football game, the head coach will be given a card listing the entire crew of officials assigned for their game. After the game, the head coach is to complete the overall rating portion of the officials section of the card and indicate their recommendation for playoff consideration. ***Mail this card to the AIA office after each game.***
- At least five officials shall be assigned to all post-season football contests.
- The game officials are responsible for the conduct of the game as prescribed by AIA adopted playing rules.
- 25 second field level clocks will be in use at championship games played at NAU Walkup Skydome, U. of A Arizona Stadium, ASU Sun Devil Stadium and University of Phoenix Stadium, as well as any other sites that have the field clock.
- The National Federation Playoff System shall be used to resolve a tie game in all state playoffs, including the state championship games. (See AIA Constitution and Bylaws, Article 23.11. Paragraph 23.11.2.4 and Paragraph 23.11.2.5 page 111).
- The AIA Bylaw 23.1.5 (Football Speed Up Rule) will be used anytime a team is ahead of an opponent by 42 or more points. Regular timing rules shall apply in the last two minutes of the game or when the score returns to less than 42 points.
- **Teams must use a Wilson ball that has the “National Federation of State High School Associations” stamp on it.**
Note: Each 1A through 5A member school that is in the first round of the state football playoffs will receive a **Wilson Collegiate Style GST F1003B** football prior to their first playoff game.
- Each participating team shall provide an AIA approved (i.e. Wilson) game ball to the game officials for use during the tournament game. It will be the responsibility of each participating school to provide ball runners to assist the officials in exchanging footballs during the game.
- If available, dressing rooms will be assigned by the Site Director; however, all players must provide their own towels and locks.
- It is recommended that a doctor, EMT personnel or a Certified Athletic Trainer and a vehicle for emergency transportation be available.
- A coach shall be in attendance during all practice and warm-up sessions.

PLEASE NOTE: Teams playing at college or professional team playing sites will use college hash marks and college goal posts. **No pre-game practice is allowed at a neutral site game site by any team.**

MEDIA CREDENTIAL POLICY

AIA has a Media Credential Policy that needs to be followed to protect the proprietary rights of the Association and to protect the student-athletes and coaches at region and state tournament events. The following link (http://aiaonline.org/news/press_center.php) is to the AIA Media Center which houses the AIA Media Credential Form and the AIA Approved Media List (those that have requested and been granted AIA media credentials). Please download the AIA Media Credential Form and should a media member need access that is not on the media list, they will need to sign off on the form. Please print out several of the Media Credential Forms so each media outlet fills out its own form. Should the media member refuse to sign off on the form, they will not be granted access to the region or state tournament event you're hosting.

At the conclusion of the event, please fax or mail those forms to the AIA so that we may follow up and credential those people the approved media list will be updated as forms are received and processed. Please download the AIA Approved Media List (which is constantly being updated) so that those members of the media that are already approved may be granted access. Please note that some members of the media might show up with Freelance Credentials. These have no pictures on them, but do allow for access to the event per the designated media outlet on the AIA Media Credential.

MEDIA

- The AIA Director of Media Marketing will issue all media credentials. Direct questions to Brian Bolitho at bbolitho@aiaonline.org or 602-385-3822.
 - Media Credentials must be requested in advance of game-day.
 - The AIA will issue media credentials to legitimate news media only
- TV/Radio Broadcasting - If a radio or television station wishes to broadcast a championship game from one of the playoff sites, a station representative must contact Brian Bolitho, AIA Director of Media Marketing, at 602-385-3822 or bbolitho@aiaonline.org to make the necessary arrangements.
- **General Broadcasting Information**
 - *Radio Stations that want to broadcast the 2A/3A/4A/5A championship games* may pick up the broadcast from the AIA sanctioned radio network by contacting the AIA Director of Media/Marketing at 602-385-3822 or bbolitho@aiaonline.org.
 - Requests for broadcasting space and telephone lines for all games not on the AIA sanctioned radio network will be honored on a first come, first serve basis by the site director.
 - Cost for broadcasting will be paid by the broadcasting station.
 - Radio advertisers must meet acceptable educational standards.
 - **Advertising by alcohol and/or tobacco companies is prohibited.**
- Television Credentials - Only television coverage crews may have credentials.
 - TV coverage consists of a station film crew desiring to shoot footage for news telecasts
 - Television stations wishing to broadcast a delayed telecast of the complete championship game must contact Brian Bolitho, AIA Director of Media Marketing at 602-385-3822 or bbolitho@aiaonline.org.



MARCHING BANDS

- The participating school bands have the option to provide musical entertainment. *The Tournament Site Director must be notified 48 hours in advance of the game whether or not the participating schools plan to provide a band for the game.*
- Pre-game and half time band performances: Each of the participating schools shall be allowed *a maximum of twelve minutes for its band show*. The visiting team's band will perform during pre-game. The visiting team has the first option to provide a band to play the National Anthem. The maximum half time shall be no more than 20 minutes.
 - In the event that neither school has a band in attendance, the Site Director will utilize a pre-recorded rendition of the National Anthem to be played prior to the start of the game.
- The Tournament Site Director will assign seating areas for participating bands. Whenever possible, bands will be seated in the permanent stands. It is the responsibility of band director(s) to arrive at game sites in sufficient time to prevent spectators from sitting in the seats designated for the band.
 - In case of a double header, the band(s) who performed for the first game will relinquish their seats for the band(s) that will perform for the second game.
- Pneumatic or inflatable wheels are permitted, they minimize the stress put on the field
- No castor wheels. They dig into the sod.

TROPHIES

The presentation of trophies will be made on the field immediately after the game. Tournament Site Directors and Coaches need to take steps to ensure that the field remains clear for this activity.

UNIFORMS

- The home team shall wear their dark jerseys and the visiting team shall wear their light jerseys.
- The visiting team is responsible for avoidance of similarity of colors; however, if there is doubt, the referee may require the home team to change. (See N.F. Football Rule Book, Rule 1-5-1-c-4, page 17). When games are played on a neutral site, the AIA recommends the home team bring two different color sets of jerseys.

QUALIFYING

The football playoffs shall be conducted in five conferences: 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A (Division I and II), and 5A (Division I and II).

- Each Conference determines the method for school teams within it's conference to qualify for the state tournament. Qualifying standards can be found in the Conference Handbooks. The AIA Conference Handbooks can be viewed online at:
http://www.aiaonline.org/athletics/conference_handbooks.php
- First round games are tentatively scheduled for the sites as indicated on the playoff brackets. **The home team will be highest seed and will host the game; however, the game sites may be changed at the discretion of the AIA State Tournament Office.**
 - 1A Conference: First two rounds – Highest seed, or if tied, top of the bracket, will host the game.
 - 2A Conference: First two rounds – Highest seed will host the game.
 - 3A Conference: First round – Highest seed will host the game. Second round games will be at a site as determined by the AIA with the highest seed as the home team
 - 4A Conference: First two rounds – Highest seed will host the game.
 - 5A Conference: First two rounds – Highest seed will host the game.

Semifinals and Championship: The game(s) will be scheduled at sites determined by the AIA. Home teams will be the highest seed.

TICKETS

AIA will provide game tickets to all sites. If you are hosting a first round game, contact the AIA office by the Monday prior to the game to receive AIA tickets.



Note: 4A and 5A first round sites will receive game tickets and game balls at the site of the AIA State Football Bracket Television Show which will be held at the KPNX Channel 12 offices.

1A/2A/3A/4A Div. II /4A Div. I/ 5A Div. II/5A Div. I CHAMPIONSHIP GAME PROCEDURE

Game procedures and instructions for the championship game participating teams will be e-mailed or faxed to the winning schools on the Monday following the semi-final game.

TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE

The 10-yard line overtime procedure in the current National Federation Football Rules Book on pages 83-86 will be used to break ties in all playoff games including the championship game.

COACHING STAFF

Only school board approved members of participating schools' football coaching staff will be permitted on the field.

PROGRAMS AND SOUVENIRS

Deadline date for all 1A/2A/3A/4A/5A AIA Football State Tournament school souvenir programs pictures and rosters is Wednesday, October 9, 2009. Instructions/deadlines for roster and photo were sent to all school athletic directors in an e-mail on September 29, 2009.

Parents, spectators and participants want to see their school team picture and names included in the souvenir program. Please make every effort to meet the posted deadlines.

Kukulski Brothers is the official supplier for AIA Programs and Souvenirs. Sale or distribution of AIA State Tournament related game programs, t-shirts or any other souvenirs by any individual or company other than the Kukulski Brothers at any AIA State Tournament playoff site or game is prohibited.

SPECTATOR BEHAVIOR

The National Federation of High School Associations disapproves of any form of taunting which is intended to embarrass, ridicule or demean others under any circumstances.

AIA Bylaw; Article 16.3.4 stipulates that student spectators, parents, or other non-school personnel that initiate or use profanity in cheers or cheers having the intent of sounding profane, single out opposing players personally and/or heckle them by directing derogatory or profane statements or chants at them, use racist remarks or direct offensive cheers /chants at opposing individuals, teams or fans are in violation of the AIA sportsmanship rules. At all contests, including region and state tournament contests, participating school's administrators have the responsibility to control their fan behaviors, either student or adult.

Any spectator conduct that becomes unruly or interferes with the orderly progress of the game will result in the suspension of the game until offending spectator(s) are removed from the game site. Artificial noisemakers are prohibited at state playoff venues. If any artificial noisemaker is brought into a game site, the item will be confiscated.



TOURNAMENT SIGNS/ARTIFICIAL NOISEMAKERS

- Signs are not permitted at any indoor tournament sponsored by the AIA. (AIA Bylaw 12.1.5)
- Artificial noisemakers are prohibited at state playoff venues. If any artificial noisemaker is brought into a game site, the item will be confiscated. The playing of music/sound effects shall only be permitted during pre-game, time-outs, intermission and post-game. (NFHS rule 1-18)
- Unsportsmanlike/derogatory signs are not permitted at any AIA state tournament venues under the administration of school site directors or AIA personnel.
- Artificial noisemakers that create an unsportsmanlike or disruptive game environment in the opinion of the game officials or site administrator are not allowed and will be confiscated.
- Disruptive/unsportsmanlike behavior by spectators will not be tolerated. Violators will be removed from the venue.

ASU - SUN DEVIL STADIUM POLICIES

The following are restricted items at all events held at Sun Devil Stadium:

No ice chests, soft or hard-sided coolers, backpacks, glass bottles, cans, thermos bottles, or similar containers will be permitted in the stadium. No artificial noise makers. No cameras with lenses larger than the width of the camera (expect to open and have camera or binoculars case inspected prior to entering the stadium). No banner poles and masts. No large (golf type) umbrellas nor any type of umbrella that has a metal tip on the top of it. No firearms/weapons.

UNIVERSITY of ARIZONA – ARIZONA STADIUM POLICIES

The following are restricted items at all events held at Arizona Stadium:

No ice chests, soft or hard-sided coolers, backpacks, glass bottles, cans, thermos bottles, or similar containers will be permitted in the stadium. No artificial noise makers. No cameras with lenses larger than the width of the camera (expect to open and have camera or binoculars case inspected prior to entering the stadium). No banner poles and masts. No large (golf type) umbrellas nor any type of umbrella that has a metal tip on the top of it. No firearms/weapons.

NAU WALKUP SKYDOME STADIUM POLICIES

Stadium policies for Northern Arizona University Walkup Skydome will be posted at a later date.



UNIVERSITY OF PHOENIX STADIUM POLICIES

Stadium policies for University of Phoenix Stadium (Glendale) are as follows:

Sportsman's Park (Stadium Parking Lot)

- All vehicles entering Sportsman's Park will be directed into a parking spot. Fans are asked to follow the direction of the parking staff to quickly park their vehicle.
- Fans that wish to park next to friends must arrive at the same time. Parking spots cannot be reserved or saved for fans arriving at a later time.
- Vehicles pulling a trailer will not be allowed access at Sportsman's Park.
- Vehicles taking more than one parking space or parked incorrectly will be subject to tow. All fees associated with the removal and impounding of the vehicle will be the responsibility of the owner.
- Tailgating in the parking lots must be limited to the area directly behind the vehicle. Tailgating in empty stalls is prohibited.
- Fans will not be allowed to rope off or section off large tailgate areas.

Fans are reminded that the following items will not be permitted to be brought inside University of Phoenix Stadium:

- Aerosol Cans
- Alcohol
- Animals (except for service animals)
- Bags larger than 12" x 12" x 12"
- Banners or signs larger than 3' x 2'
- Beverage containers – Bottles, cans and thermos bottles
- Brooms
- Clothing deemed obscene or indecent
- Coolers of any kind
- Fireworks
- Folding chairs
- Footballs and beach balls
- Illegal drugs
- Laser Pointers
- Mono/tripods
- Noise Makers (whistles, horns, bells, etc.)
- Poles or Sticks of any kind
- Umbrellas
- Weapons – Firearms & Knives
- Any item deemed inappropriate or hazardous by stadium security
