RULES

Rules shall be those of the current National Federation Wrestling Rule Book with exceptions noted in the AIA Constitution and Bylaws and these tournament instructions.

2009-10 NFHS Wrestling Rule 1-3-2 - Any wrestler's assessment that is below seven percent for males and 12 percent of females shall have a physician's release to participate. This release shall not allow a wrestler to participate at a weight class below that for which the initial assessment allows.

AIA Bylaw 31.1.5 (page 122) - Weight loss may not be more than 1.5% of the "alpha" weight (weight at time of certification) per week. Wrestler will follow the prescribed weight loss process of the NWCA weight certification model (nwcaonline.com).

DETERMINATION: Coaches or their designee (athletic director of school assessor) **MUST** print out a weigh-in sheet for every weigh-in their school participates in for the AIA wrestling season. It is required that each school present minimally two copies of their weigh-in sheets at weigh-ins, one for themselves and one for each opponent. In events of multiple schools, multiple copies of this sheet must be made available for each opponent. No wrestling may occur until the team can produce an NWCA Performance Calculator weigh-in sheet. A school cannot deny an opponent or visiting schools from using their computer system to access the NWCA Performance Calculator if they so request. (Ex. Bd. 10/19/09)

AIA Bylaw 31.1.6 (page 122); Certification Data – A wrestler must have certified his lowest competitive weight before representing a school in any wrestling match.

- Weight certification may begin Oct. 30, 2009, as determined by the AIA Executive Board.

AIA Bylaw 31.1.7 (page 122); Growth Allowance - A two-pound growth allowance will take effect on Jan. 1, 2010.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- **WEIGH IN INSTRUCTIONS:** The participating school buses will need to come from Packard Drive and then head west to Wells Fargo Arena proceed around the north side of the Arena to the WEST tunnel. Then drop off (wrestlers) at the WEST tunnel (not the east) and then take a right on Veteran's, a right on Mill, and then a right on Rio Salado. ASU Parking will be placing a large video board on the corner of Rio and Packard directing the buses into Lot 59 North. It is recommend that all of the busses park on the east side of 59 North lot be pointing west.
- The meet officials are responsible for the conduct of the meet as prescribed by playing rules adopted by the AIA.
- Each wrestler is required to be in full uniform from the time the participant steps on the mat until the end of the match.
- Weigh-in will follow Rule 4, Section 5, and pp: 17 & 19, of the 2009/2010 National Federation Wrestling Rule Book.
- All wrestlers must be checked for skin condition prior to weigh-in. The NFHS Sports Medicine Advisory Committee has provided a physical release form for wrestlers to participate with skin lesion. Form attached with this tournament guide. AIA recommends the doctor evaluating any skin lesion be a dermatologist. This form must be completed prior to weight-in or upon arrival at the site of dual meet and/or tournament. ***Please Review NFHS Wrestling Rules 4.2.4, page 15.***

- All meet personnel, other than officials; will be assigned by the Tournament Director.
- It is recommended that a doctor, EMT personnel or Certified Athletic Trainer, and a vehicle for emergency transportation be available.
- A coach must be in attendance during all warm-up sessions.
- *Coaches and wrestlers not participating in a match at Tims Toyota Center & Arizona State University must be off the competition floor area.*
- Neither the AIA nor the school of the host site shall be responsible for lost or stolen articles.
- Any coach or competitor using tobacco, alcoholic beverages or misusing drugs while at the tournament site during an athletic contest sponsored by AIA, shall be disqualified from that contest or tournament. AIA Constitution and Bylaws, Article 14: Section 14.13.1, DRUGS, ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, page 36.

TOURNAMENT SIGNS/ARTIFICIAL NOISEMAKERS/TRIPODS

- Signs are not permitted at any indoor tournament sponsored by the AIA. (AIA Bylaw 12.1.5) Artificial noisemakers are prohibited at state playoff venues. If any artificial noisemaker is brought into a game site, the item will be confiscated. Disruptive/unsportsmanlike behavior by spectators will not be tolerated. Violators will be removed from the venue.

Video Cameras: Video cameras will be allowed in the facility. However, videotaping must be done from the seats – you may not go onto the floor or stand in areas that will block traffic or obstruct view. **Tripods will not be allowed.** Please note that electrical outlets will not be available for charging video camera batteries or for the purpose of operation. Therefore, it is important that this be done before arrival to the tournament site.

SPORTSMANSHIP

- If an athlete or coach is ejected, the Sportsmanship Rule will be in effect. (See the AIA Constitution and Bylaws, Article 16. Section 16.3, pages 53-54). National Federation Rule #8 (penalty chart) pages 39-40.
- Part of sportsmanship is following directions by tournament workers.

AUTHORIZED SCHOOL PERSONNEL MAT-SIDE

- No wrestler is permitted on the wrestling floor except when participating in a match.
 - On-Deck participants must remain off the wrestling arena until the match they follow is over.
- Only two coaches, wearing an official coach's wristband, are permitted mat side. A coach with current session wristband will be allowed with an on-deck wrestler in the holding area.
Violation of this rule will result in a loss of one team point and/or coaches floor pass privilege removed.

PROTESTS

1. Cannot appeal judgment: NFHS Rule 3.1.2, page 10.
2. Correction of Error: NFHS Rule 6.6.3, page 31 & 32.
3. Protests/appeal will be reviewed by the Head Official or his designee and 2 members of the tournament games committee prior to the start of any subsequent period.
4. A loss of appeal will result in a one-point team score deduction.

SCOREBOARD OPERATOR & OFFICIAL SCORER (MAT SIDE)

AIA officials, trained in the operation of the scoreboard will be used at all tournament games and will be paid by the Tournament Site Director.

OFFICIALS

AIA registered certified officials will be used to officiate. Officials will be assigned by the State Commissioner of Officials.

MAT-SIDE SCORES TABLE (CONFERENCE)

The following may be seated at the individual conference head tables:

Individual State Tournament Seeding Guidelines

1. To be considered for seeding wrestlers must have at least a 50% winning percentage.
2. Wrestlers must wrestle a minimum of 10 matches
3. The top eight (8) wrestlers and two alternates with the highest winning percentage in weight are to be considered eligible for seeding.

Specific Seeding Criteria

1. Head to Head Competition if opponents are within 7% of overall winning percentage
2. Previous Arizona 5A State Champion
3. Arizona State Place Winner
4. Record in Weight
5. Overall Record
6. If tie remains after above criteria have been exhausted, coaches will vote on the seeding of a wrestler in a specific weight class.

4A Division I & II: Jim Threadgill by Saturday (11:00 pm), Feb. 6, 2010

- Seeding meeting for 4A Division I & II will be at Moon Valley High School
11 a.m. Sunday Feb. 7, 2010

Seeding Criteria: ONLY REGION CHAMPS WILL BE SEEDED

1. Head to head
2. State champion in weight
3. State champion in another weight
4. Record in weight (minimum of 5 matches in weight)
5. Overall record – (If records are within two(2) %) points, then a vote of the head coach or representative in attendance).
6. The second place wrestlers shall be placed in the opposite bracket from Region champion.

Seeding criteria for the 16th slot in bracket for a wildcard wrestler.

(4th place in region, head to head, record in wt.min. of 5 matches in wt. overall record, w/ 2% coaches present vote)

Should the media member refuse to sign off on the form, they will not be granted access to the region or state tournament event you're hosting.

At the conclusion of the event, please fax or mail those forms to the AIA so that we may follow up and credential those people the approved media list will be updated as forms are received and processed. Please download the AIA Approved Media List and AIA School Media List (which is constantly being updated) so that those members of the media that are already approved may be granted access. Please note that some members of the media might show up with Freelance Credentials. These have no pictures on them, but do allow for access to the event per the designated media outlet on the AIA Media Credential.

FLOOR ADMITTANCE

Each school with wrestlers competing at Tim's Toyota Center & Wells Fargo Arena will receive a maximum of four credential ID's.(Wrist Bands) This credential ID allows admittance to the floor area. The credential can be picked up at the Credential table. ***Each school must send the AIA a list of four board-approved coaches PRIOR TO Jan. 25, 2010.*** The credential table will be located at the site of the weigh-ins (1A-4A @ Bradshaw Mountain East & 5A Div I & II @ ASU Wrestling Facility . All coaches, wrestlers, Certified Athletic Trainers, and school support mat-maids must have the current wrist band per session to be admitted to the arena. All other coaches, eliminated tournament wrestlers, certified athletic trainer and school support mat-maids must have the appropriate session to be admitted to the arena.

 - The Grand March (Championship Participants) will be conducted prior to the Championship Matches.
 - 50 Year State Champion Team and Individual State Champions will be recognized
 - Coaches, wrestlers and mat maids will face the flag during the National Anthem.

TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE

Tournament Committee members serve as a representative of their Conference or of the sport of wrestling and provide expertise to the Tournament Director. This may involve planning, preparation, implementation and/or follow-up procedures for the tournament.
