- Shockbox Use in Helmets, Safety (Kevin Merrill)
 - Mr. Merrill presented a PowerPoint about the product to the committee and a sample of the product.
 - Impact Sensor that sends a signal to mobile device with a hit of 50g (linear force).
 - Shows detailed information about each player's impact data.
 - Data is exportable to Excel.
 - The sensor is for sports that utilize helmets only.
 - Currently, NOCSAE released a statement that helmets cannot be modified, which includes electronic devices.
 - Shockbox is working with NOCSAE in regards to this statement with additional testing.
 - Committee recommended distributing the NOCSAE statement and that the SMAC stands behind the statement.
 - Any school, parent and/or student involved in the use of an aftermarket item will be the responsible.
 - In addition, John Parsons stated that the clinical of these devices is yet to be validated.
 - Committee approved the above mentioned language.
- Heat Acclimatization for Indoor Sports

- Guidelines have been set for all indoor sports.
- Supplement Statement (Dr. Parsons)
 - Dr. Parsons shared a revision of AIA Bylaw Article 14.13
 <u>Article 14 General Previsions</u>
 - Committee approved the revision to Article 14.13 for Board approval.
- Wrestling weigh-ins (Dave Hayward)
 - Mr. Hayward discussed revision options for Article 31.1.4 (Weight Certification Models)
 - o Article 31 Wrestling
 - Committee recommends the removal of Alternative 2 (31.1.4.2) and replace it with wording for the Bod Pod (Air Displacement Plethysmography)
 - Committee has requested to have Mike Moyer (NWCA) speak to the committee at the September meeting.
- Concussion Network Update (Dr. Cardenas)
 - Brainbook Concussion course has been taken by 160,830 students
 - A new version is coming out soon; shorter length, new videos and animation.
 - Impact testing has been increasing.
 - A new concussion video game for youth will be released soon.
 - NATA released a statement regarding best practices recently; AIA has posted the statement online and will also be including it in the AIA August Newsletter.
