EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Tolleson Union High School District will participate in the 2021 spring sports season, however, they will only be competing against other Tolleson Union High School District schools.

Phoenix Union High School District is requesting to participate in a modified winter season for basketball, soccer and wrestling. They will be competing against other district schools through the month of April. There will be an overlap between their winter and spring sports seasons. PUHSD schools have begun spring practices and plan to participate with the AIA. On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board approved PUHSD to have a modified winter season that will exceed the season of sport.

Legislative Council took place on Friday, March 5, 2021 at Xavier College Prep. Thank you to Xavier, Sister Lynn, Sister Joan, the staff and the student ambassadors for all their assistance. The Legislative Council Meeting Minutes can be found here.

The winter state tournaments are underway. The girls' wrestling state tournament concluded on March 6th and the boys' tournament begins on March 16th. Both soccer and basketball are in week two of the tournament. The spiritline state competition was held at Poston Butte on March 6th. We are very appreciative to be able to have a season and state tournaments, however, it wouldn't be possible without the help and support of the administrators, coaches, student athletes, parents and the community.

REQUEST – AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 30 – TRACK

The Track Sports Advisory Committee is requesting the following amendment to article 30.4 number of meets in season be considered and approved as **Emergency Legislation** for the 2021 season.

30.4 NUMBER OF MEETS IN SEASON

30.4.4 Schools may send individuals to only one non-scoring invitational without counting the meet as one of the 13 varsity meets. Schools can additionally send athletes to one non-scoring specialty meet without counting the meet as one of the 14 varsity meets. These meets would include distance classics, throws meets or a field event only meet.

Rationale: coaches who send a partial team to a specialty meet has that count against their meet schedule limit. These meets might only have two or three events. This year (2021) more schools are having a hard time getting into meets as the host meet director is either limiting the number of schools, or reducing the amount of entries that a team might enter. A specialty meet usually will allow for more team members to participate and have an opportunity to qualify for state. These meets are very limited in number and currently there are only four. The Show Low Field Event Meet, The Buckeye Throws meet and the Ironwood Ridge and Saguaro Distance classics.

A poll was sent out by Jen Burks to all head track coaches. Response: 140 in favor of the modification proposal and 17 against the proposal.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board <u>approved</u> the above amendment to Article 30.4 for the 2021 track season only.

REQUEST - AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 32 - BEACH VOLLEYBALL

32.6 CONTEST PARTICIPATION

- 32.6.1 When a student enters an interscholastic contest, regardless of the length of time, it shall be considered participation in the interscholastic contest.
- 32.6.2 Schools shall not have less than 12 players suit up, available to participate, or be listed on the roster of a school team for regular season matches or post-season tournaments.

Rationale: 32.6.2 needs to be removed as it prevents schools from participating even if they have a full roster of 10 players.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board approved the above amendment to Article 32.6.

NEW SCHOOL MEMBERSHIP - SITE VISITS CONDUCTED

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board <u>approved</u> the membership application for the following school beginning the 2021-2022 school year and requested the membership be balloted.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board **approved** the membership application and requested a site visit be conducted.

FOOTBALL RECLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE LETTER

Members from the Football Reclassification Committee submitted a letter for clarification regarding scheduling and who is responsible for creating football schedules.

After discussion amongst the Executive Board it was confirmed that the Conferences have been and will continue to be responsible for creating schedules for their schools.

SOUTHERN ARIZONA SHOWCASE EVENT

Dr. Trujillo, Superintendent of Tucson Unified School District, presented information on a showcase event that would be hosted by Tucson Unified School District at Tucson High.

The event would take place the week of May 2-8, 2021 with practices and clinics being held. The showcase game would be played on Saturday, May 8th. The event is to showcase graduating seniors that missed out on a fall season due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

On a motion made, seconded and carried the Executive Board denied the request based on the following:

- Article 14.7 does not permit an event like this to occur during the school year.
- Concern regarding catastrophic insurance coverage for the student athletes that may participate.
- Concern regarding status of helmet reconditioning from schools that may be participating.
- Concern regarding student athletes leaving their spring sports to participate in this event.

SCHOOL VIOLATIONS

YUMA CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL - Catholic Diocese of Tucson

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 12 Recruitment Rule (15.12.4.14)

Reported Violation:

The student participated as an individual on a school team last year and our new coach was the coach of that team. He was hired at Yuma Catholic at the end of last school year. The student wanted to transfer to Yuma Catholic and all parties involved were notified that transferring to Yuma catholic was a prior contact violation and would result in the student sitting out the entire season. They player's family and player decided to transfer anyway and sit the entire season. The new coach then played the individual in three away games resulting in a violation of prior contact. Administration was notified today.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests forfeited. After an investigation, the new coach was called in and terminated.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Yuma Catholic High School **Girls' Soccer Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

ROUND VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL - Round Valley Unified School District

Rule: Article 17. Coaches and Coaching, Section 4 Coach's / Sponsor's Code of Ethics (17.4.2.1)

Reported Violation:

Our boys' basketball JV coach approached an official after the contest and had a verbal altercation. Explicit words were used that did not follow the coaches' spirit or letter.

Schools Corrective Action:

Based on the investigation, the coach was suspended from coaches for two games. RVHS athletic department has discussed and coached the coach that had the infraction on how to handle his demeanor and abide by the Coaches Code of Conduct, prior, during and post-game.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Round Valley High School **Boy's Basketball Program** on **Warning** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

AMERICAN LEADERSHIP ACADEMY - IRONWOOD - American Leadership Academy

Rule: Article 22. Basketball, Section 5 Number of Games in a Season (22.5.3)

Reported Violation:

We had a boys' basketball player play in 7 quarters combined in both our freshman and JV boys' basketball game vs Combs on 2/10/21. His quarters were mismanaged due to lack of communication between coaches.

Schools Corrective Action:

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the American Leadership Academy - Ironwood **Boys' Basketball Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

MARANA HIGH SCHOOL – Marana Unified School District

Rule: Article 2. Membership, Section 5 Responsibility of School Administrators (2.5.2.3)

Reported Violation:

Marana girls' soccer head coach approached an official immediately after the game to seek clarification regarding specific and overall officiating of the contest. Marana head coach recognizes that approaching the officials after the game to voice concerns is not an appropriate channel. Marana head coach apologizes for his actions and any harm that he may have caused to the official or the opposing school.

Schools Corrective Action:

Conference with the head coach and AD has taken place with direction set to avoid this action in the future. Head coach and AD have reviewed AIA Bylaws specifically 2.5.2.3 Conduct of Participants and intend to engage in ongoing follow-up.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Marana High School **Girls' Soccer Program** on **Warning** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

THATCHER HIGH SCHOOL - Thatcher Unified School District

Rule: Article 22. Basketball, Section 5 Number of Games in a Season (22.5.3)

Reported Violation:

We were using freshman boys' basketball players to fill our JV program roster. This was a need to keep the JV program in existence. All we wanted was for the boys to get some experience with playing time during this COVID situation.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests forfeited. We will split our freshman athletes between the freshman and JV games that we have remaining on our schedule.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Thatcher High School **Activities Program** on **Warning** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

LIBERTY HIGH SCHOOL - Peoria Unified School District

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

A Liberty student completed all graduation requirements in December and was not enrolled in any classes the spring semester. Student competed in four girls' soccer games.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests forfeited. Coaches will check schedules of all athletes prior to tryouts and at semester. Athletics department will check all rosters to ensure all athletes are enrolled in the required number of classes. Athletic department will also check the list of early grads and communicate with them that they are not eligible to participate in athletics and activities.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Liberty High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

IRONWOOD RIDGE HIGH SCHOOL – Amphitheater Unified District

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 10 Transfer Rule (15.10)

Reported Violation:

A girls' basketball player transferred from Pusch Ridge and should have been ineligible for competition until February 16, 2021. The Athletic Secretary inadvertently listed her as being cleared to participate. Because the student was marked as cleared, the coach allowed her to play in the first three games of the season.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests Forfeited. The AD reviewed the clearance procedures with the athletic secretary and modified the spreadsheet used to track the required paperwork received for each student athlete. Steps were added to mark if a student is a transfer and if the student completed the 550 form. In addition, athletic secretary was trained on how to use the transfer portal on the AIA dashboard. To check for the completion of 550 forms for all transfer students. Upon completing these steps the athletic secretary will notify the AD of transfer students who have registered to play sports. The AD will review the information and note the results of eligibility for the transfer student before marking the student as cleared to participate.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Ironwood Ridge High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

SEQUOIA CHARTER HIGH SCHOOL

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 10 Transfer Rule (15.10)

Reported Violation:

False information was given to receiving school. Primavera student that came from PHH Prep after investigation it was found that the student had attended two Tempe schools before going online & Prep. This would make him ineligible for boys' basketball for a full year.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests Forfeited. Player was pulled form play with investigation on February 3, 2021. Student did not play 1/22 or 1/25 game (was out of state for family matters).

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Sequoia Charter High School **Activities Program** on **Warning** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22. Per Bylaw the Sequoia Charter High School boys' basketball team is ineligible for post season.

NOGALES HIGH SCHOOL – Nogales Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

Student attended competition at Rincon/University on 2/9/21 when not eligible to play.

Schools Corrective Action:

Situation was not communicated properly. A better system of communication will be put in place so all parties are aware of ineligible players. Documentation of all ineligible student-athletes will be provided to coaches staff prior to weekly competitions.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, <u>accepted</u> the report from Nogales High School.

LEE WILLIAMS HIGH SCHOOL – Kingman Unified

Rule: Article 15. Student Eligibility Rules, Section 3 Enrollment Rule (15.3.1)

Reported Violation:

It has come to my attention that one of our wrestlers who competed in the first competition of the season on January 22, was ineligible due to graduating early. I immediately called the coach who was on his way to the next competition, and informed him that this student cannot compete until we investigate the information. Upon investigation, we found that there were holes in our process of early graduation that does not include athletics. We are taking steps to fix this problem and we have checked to see if any other athletes graduated early.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. The form for students to graduate early should include sports questions. All early graduates should be signed off by the athletic department.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Lee Williams High School **Activities Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

YOUNGKER HIGH SCHOOL - Buckeye Union High School District

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 2 Practice (14.2.1)

Reported Violation:

Our JV boys' basketball coaches arranged a practice on a Sunday afternoon, which is in violation of Article 14.2.1.

Schools Corrective Action:

The AD worked with a presented policy and procedure, per the AIA on permissible practice days. The AD also presented on impactful practices, which is a part of the 360 coaching philosophy, which Youngker subscribes. The impactful practices presentation educates coaches on making practice time more effective as opposed to practicing more.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Youngker High School **Boys' Basketball Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

<u>PINNACLE HIGH SCHOOL</u> – Paradise Valley Unified School District Rule: Article 26. Soccer, Section 5 Number of Games in Season (26.5.3)

Reported Violation:

A player participated in 17 matches as of 3/3/21 (both JV & varsity) exceeding the maximum 14 per season. The head coach errantly thought that this athlete could play in one half of a JV match and one half a varsity match, and this would count as one total match.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contests forfeited. The bylaw that governs the total number of competitions an athlete may participate has been reviewed with the coach and they understand that any participation in a game/match counts as one total game toward that athletes allowed regular season competitions.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Pinnacle High School **Boys' Soccer Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

LAKE HAVASU HIGH SCHOOL – Lake Havasu Unified

Rule: Article 14. General Provisions, Section 4 Nonschool Participation (14.4.1) // Article 16. Penalties and Appeals, Section 2 Ineligible Player (16.2.1)

Reported Violation:

Lake Havasu had 3 JV boys' soccer athletes who went and practiced with their club team on Monday, 2/1. They thought it was okay since the JV team has not yet played a game. On 2/2, one of the JV players was called up to the varsity game and played in the last 5 minutes due to a lopsided score. We found out on Friday 2/5, that the 3 boys had participated in a club practice on 2/1.

Schools Corrective Action:

Contest forfeited. Our line of communication with our local club teams has been tremendous. The relationship between our club programs and the high school is positive and we work well together. I do believe that while this unfortunate event does come with consequences, that is was an honest mistake by the club coach to allow participation of the 3 JV players. After speaking with the club director, from my understanding the coach did know that it was a violation to have in season athletes practice at club during the season of sport. However, unfortunately he thought that since the JV players have not yet had a game that they were still able to participate in practice.

To further try and prevent this from happening in the future, we will keep all current preventative measures in place, with the addition of myself, or our varsity boys and girls' coaches, speaking at the yearly club meeting that the Club director holds for all of this coaches to further educate on AIA and Lake Havasu High School policies.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Lake Havasu High School **Boys' Soccer Program** on **Warning** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.

MOUNTAIN VIEW MESA HIGH SCHOOL - Mesa Public Schools

Rule: Article 19. Policies and Procedures, Section 1 Violations (19.1.1)

Reported Violation:

Violation of 2020 AIA Spiritline modifications – no stunting or tumbling will be permitted at basketball games. On 2/2/21 our varsity pom team executed multiple tumbling skills and stunts/lifts during their halftime performance. Coaches indicate that they were unclear regarding the definition of stunting and tumbling at basketball games.

Schools Corrective Action:

On 1/14/21 I met with our spiritline coaches via Webex to review all winter sports modifications, including the prohibition on stunting and tumbling at basketball games. On 2/3/21 I received an anonymous tip suggesting that our pom squad had violated a winter sports modification during their performance at the basketball game the previous evening. When I questioned our coaches on 2/3/21 about the teams halftime performance the night before, the coaches indicated that they were unclear about what exactly constituted tumbling and stunting. As a result of our conversation, I reached out to Ashley Gronewold for clarification, which she provided on 2/3/21, and which I forwarded to our coaches for their reference. At the time, again reviewed the AIA modifications with our coaching staff, and included Ashley's clarification, as a second in-service for our coaches. Moving forward from that date, both myself and our coaches have consulted directly with the AIA whenever either of us has felt that clarification has been necessary.

Executive Board Action:

Executive Board, in accordance with Article 16, Section 1 of the AIA Bylaws, placed the Mountain View Mesa High School **Spiritline Program** on **Advisement** for one year 3/15/21-3/15/22.
