

Rules and Clarifications:

Rule 4 – The Player's Equipment

Purpose of Rule: Rule 4 covers equipment that players may use during a round.

(4) Audio and Video.

The AIA Golf Sports Advisory Games Committee has adopted the Local Rule prohibiting or restricting the use of audio and video devices during a round (i.e., ear buds).

<u>In all AIA Qualifying Competitions, the "Desert Rule" that may appear on many golf course scorecards is NOT in effect.</u>

If the desert area is not clearly marked as a Red Penalty area, the desert would need to be played as "General Area". If a ball is lost/ not found in the desert (General Area) the player needs to play his next shot from where previously played. If he/ she hit a provisional golf ball, then the provisional golf ball would be played.

In addition, the MLR (Model Local Rule) E-5 is NOT in effect for all AIA Qualifying Competitions. The link below describes MLR E-5, which should not be played for AIA Matches/ Tournaments.
